

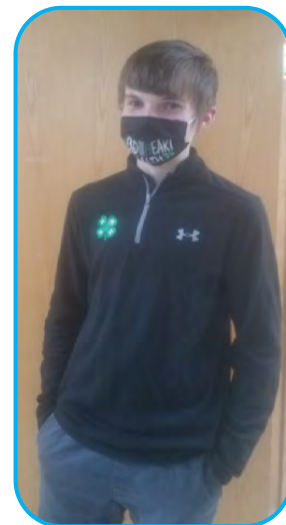

4-H Clubs can resume face-to-face meetings with the following guidelines: A *Safety Management Plan* is required for all in-person events hosted by the University of Illinois (including 4-H meetings and events) or in a facility owned or managed by the university. The *Safety Management Plan* should include these essential details.

Currently, we are at gathering size limit.

Face-to-face events, **outdoors**: Gathering size limited to lesser of 50 people or 50% of space capacity. Social distancing and face coverings required.

Face-to-face events, **indoors**: Gathering size limited to lesser of 50 people or 50% of space capacity. Social distancing and face coverings required.

The numbers above would include parents that attend the meetings. For anyone that does not feel comfortable attending in person, please contact your 4-H leader to see if other accommodations can be made. We do not want anyone to feel they must attend in person. Your safety, your family, and our 4-H leaders safety is our number one priority! 4-H clubs that have a private 4-H club page can you do a Facebook live, Zoom, Google meet, or if anyone knows of other ways members can still participate in the club meeting virtually. This is a great opportunity for Jr. Leaders to take charge and organize. If you have any questions or need any assistance, please contact Patti Logan.

Top Dog Club will be resuming in-person meetings for the upcoming summer. The first meeting will be held on May 4, 2021 at the Effingham County Fairgrounds. New families/members are asked to come at 5:30pm for a brief orientation on club rules, club meeting expectations, and what to expect when showing dogs in Effingham County. Orientation will be followed by our first regular meeting of the summer at 6pm. Prior families/members are welcome to come to the orientation at 5:30pm, but may also choose to come at 6pm at the start of the meeting. As a reminder, prior to the first meeting, all dogs must have CURRENT proof of vaccination for the following vaccinations: Rabies, Distemper, Leptospirosis, Hepatitis, Parvovirus, Parainfluenza, and Bordatella. Please provide proof of vaccination to any leader prior to getting your dog out of the vehicle at the first meeting. For anyone interested in showing dogs, please ensure that you are signed up as a member of Top Dog Club in 4-H Online, as initial communications from the leaders will come via email from that list of members. Communications will begin mid- to late-April.

QUALITY ASSURANCE & ETHICS (QA&E):

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats. Members must take the training whether they own a live animal or not. It is advised that they complete this one time as soon as they are enrolled in the project area. Counties will monitor completion of this. Failure to complete QA&E will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs. The website is open year round @ <http://web.extension.illinois.edu/gaec/>

NOTE: Youth must be logged on to a computer for this program, either a desktop or laptop; not an iPad or iPhone. The program cannot capture the information for county staff to see if it is completed using iPads or iPhones.

Project Enrollment Deadlines

In order to be eligible to show at the Effingham County 4-H Shows, members must be enrolled in their projects by May 1, 2021. The 4-H program year is September 1, 2020 through August 31, 2021. 4-H enrollment is open all year long, however members must follow deadlines to show. To register visit:

With the 4-H Fair season quickly approaching there will be a few policies and procedures put into effect for our exhibitors. First, as a reminder the only two species that are allowed to be leased are horses and canine. All other livestock are exempt from the lease provision.

Second, exhibitors wishing to show goats and sheep will be required to submit photos of their project. Required photos will include full view of left side, full view of right side, and any and all other identifiable distinguishing marks or scars.

PHOTOS OF MARKET LIVESTOCK – Species that are required to submit photos of their animals are: sheep, swine, and goat.

- a. Beef will receive tattoos in each ear. All beef steers are required to come to weigh in.
- b. Swine exhibitors will need to produce ear notches and tag numbers by June 1.
- c. Sheep & Goats take a picture of scrapie tags. All photos must be turned into the Effingham Extension office by June 1.

Quality Assurance & Ethics (QA&E):

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats. Members must take the training whether they own a live animal or not. It is advised that they complete this one time as soon as they are enrolled in the project area. Failure to complete QA&E will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs. The website is open year round @ <http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/>

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

The YQCA is a livestock quality assurance program that is replacing PQA, which no longer exists. This training replaces the Quality Assurance & Ethics (QAEC) program for youth in the following species: dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats. All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program yearly. Youth must either attend a face-to-face class or certify on-line via the website <http://yqca.org>. The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. The online version is broken up into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, seniors 15-18, and young adults 19-21. This certification is annual with test out options of 1-3 years. Youth exhibiting swine at the Illinois State Fair and 4-H fairs are no longer required to be PQA plus certified. The cost for the face-to-face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

Illinois youth learn skills to become healthy living changemakers

URBANA, Ill. – The past year has presented many challenges to people's physical, emotional, and mental health. Risk factors such as poverty, neglect, and violence can make the challenges more intense, and social isolation and uncertainty from COVID-19 may continue to negatively impact community health for some time to come. 4-H Youth now have the tools to become healthy living changemakers right in their communities through the leadership of prominent lifestyle and health experts at the recent National 4-H Summit for Healthy Living.

Illinois 4-H youth represented Illinois in facilitator, speaker, and ambassador roles.

Designed for grades 9 through 12, the summit brought together teen health leaders from across the country to focus on helping teens develop the knowledge and skills to address today's issues facing nutrition education, physical fitness, wellness, and emotional well-being. Fifteen teens were chosen to represent Illinois at the conference as 4-H Healthy Living Teen Ambassadors.

Over 500 ambassadors gathered for this virtual conference.

“The changes that came from holding the conference virtually were amazing,” says Susan Sloop, University of Illinois Extension youth development educator. “The virtual format allowed youth to participate in a way they couldn't before.” Twelve collegiate facilitators were chosen to assist with the new event format, including Metropolis, Illinois youth Kaitlyn May.

“It was an incredible honor to be selected as a collegiate facilitator for the 2021 National Healthy Living Summit and to represent Illinois 4-H in the process,” May says. “I was fortunate to be able to attend in person a couple of years ago and learned so much from it. To be able to be on the facilitator side of it this year was a great experience and I hope to be able to participate again next year. I enjoyed the collaboration among all of the facilitators as we planned activities. It was great to meet so many new 4-H members from across the country.”

Illinois' Elizabeth Weidner, 2021 4-H Youth in Action Award Winner, provided the capnote address on her experience battling childhood cancer and becoming an advocate for childhood cancer research.

These delegates will now have the opportunity to take what they have learned, assess the needs of this community, create an action plan, and compete for an opportunity to receive a National 4-H stipend to implement their plan. '

“We're challenging our ambassadors to ask ‘How healthy is my community?’” Sloop says. “We hope they take a really holistic approach in assessing their communities and creating their action plans.”

Ninety-nine percent of the teens who attended the 2019 Healthy Living Summit reported that it helped them become leaders and create change in their communities.
