January - February: Backpack Battles

Sweet Treats Party

Club with most creative method of collection AND club with highest percentage of items collected! 4-H signage should be present. Collection site should be on display for at least 30 days. Food will support youth who are eating at home on the week-end in the absence of a school lunch. Suggested items for collection include easy to make food items such as: Dinty Moore/Hormel/Pace type microwaveable meals, Chef Boyardee type microwaveable meals, Rice or Macaroni ready to microwave cups, microwaveable soup bowls, granola bars, nuts and trail mixes, individual cereals, individual cups of applesauce/fruit, peanut butter and crackers, individual "to go" type containers of peanut butter, individual servings of vegetables. etc. Items collected should be delivered to local Extension Office by March 4.



March - May: Wheel Into Spring

Pizza Prize

Club with most creative method of collection AND club with highest percentage of items collected! 4-H signage should be present. Collection site should be on display for at least 30 days. Garden Tools/Supplies/Seeds collected should be delivered to local Extension Office by June 3 (to benefit low income families interested in growing their own food).

June - July: Christmas in July/Stuff the Bus Popsicle Party

Club with highest percentage of items collected and most community partners involved! 4-H signage should be present. Collection site should be on display for at least 30 days. School supplies collected should be delivered to local Extension Office by August 1.



Tips & Tricks:

- Have each participating member tag 3 Friends/Family Members and let them know they're "It" for whatever the specific challenge is
- Have each participating member reach out to 3 businesses and ask them to support your challenge somehow. Let us know who these partners are so we can give them a social media shout out!

We will have a visual goal meter at the local Extension Office and we will be keeping track of our progress all year long. Please help us fill the progress meter!
