

## **McHenry County 4-H Friday Blast**

#### Greetings 4-H families,

I have had many questions recently about whether or not there will be a fair. *Golly, I sure hope so!* As many of you, I had really just expected we would be back to normal by August. I kept thinking, "We have time, let's wait and see what happens." Then I began to see a lot of social media posts from 4-H Educators & Coordinators across the country being asked the same questions about fair. Along with schools, towns and cities, summer concerts and festivals, we just have no way of knowing what is going to happen in the future. We are waiting, watching and wondering right along with you.

So when I hear questions like; "Should I bother doing my 4-H project?" "Should I get my livestock animals?" The truth is that is a family decision. My family, along with many of yours, may need to consider a contingency plan for an outlet for our market livestock animals. (Again, I sure hope not... Also, you should ALWAYS have a contingency plan any year.)

I'd like you to keep some things in mind while you are determining the answer to the previous questions... The word "Project" means <u>all</u> the things you learn throughout the 4-H year. Your 4-H "project" consist of doing lessons from your project book, trying different recipes, experiments, hiking, biking or feeding and caring for your animal. Those are all the things you *do* while *working* on your "project". What you bring to the fair, like your plate of cookies, project board, artwork or animal, is what you have chosen as your project "show" item.

So if you are unsure if you should do your 4-H project(s), ask yourself; Why are you in 4-H? What do you hope to gain from your 4-H experience? What can you learn that will help you grow in mind, body and spirit?

I understand that, YES, the Fair is absolutely, without a doubt, 99% of people's favorite thing about 4-H. As we have seen in-school attendance, graduation ceremonies, proms, sporting events and performances all canceled, we simply cannot guarantee there will be a fair as we know it this year. In fact, no one can guarantee any event will happen this year. BUT... we will do our best to help you be successful because.... 4-H is *more* than just the fair.

#### 4-H is:

- Learning by doing.
- Learning new skills and gaining knowledge.
- Learning to set goals and gaining leadership skills.
- Learning to develop a sense of belonging, mastery, independence and generosity.
- Learning to work hard and work with your hands.
- Learning about the arts, cooking, health, technology, environment and natural resources.
- Learning about civic engagement, finance, Intercultural studies, entrepreneurship.
- Learning about agriculture and food production.
- Learning how to care for your animals and develop a bond, you will not forget and can never replace.
- Learning resilience, determination and never giving up hope.
- And the best thing about 4-H is... Learning to cherish the time spent and lesson learned with your family.

These are all the things I <u>can</u> guarantee you will gain if you do your 4-H project whether there is a "fair" or not. I can also guarantee you that we are working diligently to find creative, alternative ways for you to "show" what you have learned during your 4-H experience <u>if</u> we have to, even if it may not look the same as it has in years past. However, I cannot, guarantee you a state fair ribbon or a plaque; I cannot guarantee you a grand champion animal; and I cannot guarantee you will earn a big auction check. I can guarantee you that as 4-Hers, we are all in this together and your 4-H family will not let you down!



Public Speaking & Horse Speaking Contest

- McHenry County Farm Bureau in the Auditorium
- Sign in begins 9:00am. Presentations begin 9:15am.
- Members must be enrolled in Communications:
   Public presentation OR Horse projects in 4HOnline

One of the most important skills that 4-H members can learn is to speak in front of a group. In 4-H, members have many opportunities to practice this skill. Besides doing presentations at the club meetings, members have the opportunity to participate in the Public Presentation contest.

This contest is open to all youth interested in presenting in the following categories: formal speech, illustrated speech, oral interpretation, or an original work. Horse project members are eligible to participate in Horse Speeches for points toward Horse Master.

#### **COMMUNICATIONS: PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS**

 Formal Speeches (4-8 mins) share the presenter's own unique view and are intended to motivate, persuade, or inform an audience and may include a call to action.
 Youth deliver a speech on any topic they wish (Original

- Oratory), or choose one of the four topics on which to speak (Topical Response)
- Illustrated Speeches (4-8 mins) may be used to inform, persuade, or motivate the audience while using a visual aid. Visual aids may be two dimensional, threedimensional, or digital. Youth may include audience participation.
- Original works (4-8 mins) must be written entirely by the presenter. It may be presented as an individual or a twoperson team entry. Manuscripts must be sent in advance to the contest. Presentations may be designed for TV, radio, or online media and must be presented live.
- 4. Oral Interpretation (4-8 mins) must be published works, and manuscripts or transcripts must be submitted prior to the event. They may be presented as an individual or a two-person team entry.

**HORSE SPEECHES** - Horse Project members may earn points towards the 2020 Horse Master Competition

- 1. **Original individual formal speech** *Junior 5-10 minutes, Senior 7-10 minutes*
- 2. **Original individual presentation**: *9-12 mins*. either demonstration (step by step process) or illustrated talk on an idea or topic; both use visual aids.
- 3. **Original team presentation:** *10-15 mins.* either demonstration (step by step process) or illustrated talk on an idea or topic; both using visual aids.
- 4. Interpretive Reading 3-5 mins is the art of reading aloud from a printed page. The reading must be published works that are horse-related. They may be prose, poetry, short stories, play cuttings, narratives, book or review, or theatrical.

# Illinois Extension office suspends regular office hours: McHenry and Lake Counties

As the University of Illinois continues to address the impacts of COVID-19, the safety and well-being of our staff and communities remain our top priorities.

Following Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines, campus leadership has implemented social-distancing protocols that include most faculty and staff working remotely, effective March 17, 2020.






## " Hands to Larger Service"
