COMMUNICATIONS: PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

- Formal Speeches (4-8 mins) share the presenter's own unique view and are intended to motivate, persuade, or inform an audience and may include a call to action. Youth deliver a speech on any topic they wish (Original Oratory), or choose one of the four topics on which to speak (Topical Response)
- Illustrated Speeches (4-8 mins) may be used to inform, persuade, or motivate the audience while using a visual aid. Visual aids may be two dimensional, threedimensional, or digital. Youth may include audience participation.
- Original works (4-8 mins) must be written entirely by the presenter. It may be presented as an individual or a twoperson team entry. Manuscripts must be sent in advance

- to the contest. Presentations may be designed for TV, radio, or online media and must be presented live.
- 4. **Oral Interpretation** (4-8 mins) must be published works, and manuscripts or transcripts must be submitted prior to the event. They may be presented as an individual or a two-person team entry.

About YQCA or Youth for the Quality and Care of Animals

For members enrolled in dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats: All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program certifying online via the website: http://yqca.org. The cost for the online training is \$12. PRINT A COPY FOR YOUR RECORDS. You may need this for fair, especially STATE FAIR!

About QAEC or Quality Assurance and Ethics Certification

For members enrolled in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats: The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is still required for youth in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, cats & small pets. You only need to take it once in your lifetime. Those who do not complete the training will be removed from the animal science project and will not be eligible to exhibit at county fairs. The website is open year round @ http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/. NOTE: Youth must be logged on to a computer for this program, either a desktop or laptop; not an iPad or iPhone.

The State Youth Leadership Team plans and implements the state Jr. Leadership Conference, plans and teaches the Speaking for Illinois 4-H program, and assists (behind the scenes and in front of the audience) for many other statewide events. Team members have the opportunity to serve on statewide planning committees and advisory groups, including the Illinois 4-H Foundation Board of Directors, Illinois Farm Bureau Youth Education Committee, Illini Summer Academies planning committee, and Teen Leadership Conference planning committee. Members also have the first opportunity to attend National 4-H Conference in Washington, D.C. each spring.

The 4-H Everyday Sportsman's Skills Challenge is currently underway and runs continuously until July 15, 2020. Interested 4-H Members are presented with three sportsman's skills at a time which they learn by viewing suggested videos. Once they've mastered the skills, they contact their 4-H leader or 4-H staff person to communicate what they've learned. Dana McNamara is an early Huntley High School graduate in December 2019.


