Summer is flying by so quickly and the 4-H shows are just around the corner! We want to make sure you are prepared and up to date with all the news!


As you are aware, all projects presented will be in a Show and Go format. No projects will be left at the Crawford County Fairgrounds. Please read this entire letter for show schedules and locations. If you have any questions or need reasonable accommodations, call the Crawford County Extension Office at 618-546-1549.

- Check your 4-H handbook online for ALL project requirements for your general projects and livestock. https://extension.illinois.edu/cce/4-h-crawford-county
- An excused absence form is needed if you are unable to exhibit your project yourself, another 4-H'er must exhibit the project for you. Call the office for an absence form.
- LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS: Make sure you have completed your YQCA training. This is a
 yearly mandatory course that must be done before you can show your beef, dairy,
 goat, sheep, or swine project. YOU WILL NOT SHOW WITHOUT IT.
- LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS: Pens will be available to you. We recommend showing off of your trailer, but if you are not able to do so, pens are available. They will not be marked, these are on a first come first serve basis. ALL PENS MUST BE CLEANED BE-FORE YOU LEAVE.
- Health Papers: Do not forget to get your health papers! Horses, do not forget your
 Coggins papers, and rabbits and poultry do not need health papers.
- Auction: This will be done in a virtual format again this year. Please refer to a 4-H
 Extension and Foundation member, the Foundation food stand, or the 4-H Extension and Foundation Facebook page for more information and details.
- Horse Exhibitors, reminder that helmets must be used when mounted on horseback.
 This is a requirement that must be followed.

- GENERAL PROJECTS: LOCATION CHANGE. Due to the low number of general projects,
 we have decided to move the judging to the Crawford County Fairgrounds for a one
 day judging rather than spreading the judging out to multiple days. Judging will take
 place on WEDNESDAY JULY 21 in the Exhibit barn at the fairgrounds. Check in will
 begin at 4:30 and judging will begin at 5:00 pm. NO PROJECTS WILL BE LEFT AT THE
 FAIRGROUNDS. We will take your picture with your project on the way out of the barn
 and then you may leave.
- General projects results will be available on our Facebook page beginning Friday July
 We will also announce any special award winners at this time! Any judges sheets,
 special ribbons, and state fair packets will be available for pick up at the Extension
 Office beginning Friday July 22 as well.
- Crawford County Day at the Illinois State Fair will be Saturday August 14th in Springfield Illinois. State Fair packets will be available for pick up at the office on Friday July 22.
- <u>Liability</u>— 4-H will not be responsible or liable for any livestock or general projects left
 at the fairgrounds, as well as for any injuries that may occur to livestock or humans. If
 livestock is left after the shows, it is the sole responsibility of the 4-H'er and their family to care for those animals. If you are planning to leave animals on the grounds after
 the shows, you are responsible for cleaning your pens and making sure your area is
 clean before leaving the fairgrounds.
- Camping— 4-H is not responsible for any campers on the grounds during fair week.
 Please contact the Crawford County Fair board to maintain a spot and pay for any camping spots.

COVID Guidelines:


- 1. The University will no longer require fully vaccinated people to wear face coverings or practice social distancing indoors or outdoors. "Fully Vaccinated" means 14 days after your final dose.
- 2. Face coverings for youth under 12 and people who are not fully vaccinated will be required indoors. Masks may be removed outdoors only when it is possible to maintain social distance of at least 6 feet.
- 3. These policies are grounded in the honor code. Participants will self-identify as vaccinated or unvaccinated; staff will not verify vaccination status for staff, youth, families, or volunteers. The 4-H Program teaches youth the values of honesty and integrity and this is a chance for us all to model and represent those principals. Youth will continue to pay attention to not only our words, but also our actions.
