Quality Assurance and Ethics—QAE

For members enrolled in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats: The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for youth in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs and cats. You only need to take it <u>once in your lifetime</u>. Those who don't complete the training will be removed from the animal science project and will not be eligible to exhibit at county fairs. YQCA Youth for the Quality Care of Animals

Boone County Exhibitors showing **Dairy Cattle, Beef Cattle, Swine, Sheep, and/or Goats** need to take the YQCA training to be eligible to exhibit at the 2020 4-H Shows. There will be two methods of completing the course either online (\$12) or attending a face-to-face training (\$3). Either way, you will need to go to the YQCA website to register https://yqca.learngrow.io/Account/Login. You will sign on to YQCA using your <u>4-H Online username and</u> password. Next, you will select the name of the youth taking the training. A course list will then come up on your screen and you will need to choose either online or instructor led. When you choose, instructor led, choose Illinois and click select training. Choose the date and location for the training you wish to attend, there are many counties with trainings; make sure you choose a Boone County class. Once you have selected a training a new screen will show you what class you have selected and you will need to select purchase the class. The next screen will ask you to enter a payment by entering a credit card number.
