Who can join 4-H?

Any person, regardless of race, color, religion, gender, national origin, ancestry, marital status, familial status, sexual orientation or disability, may enroll as a 4-H member.

- Youth who are 8 years of age and • have not reached their 19th birthday on or before September 1, 2019 may enroll in 4-H clubs and groups.
- Youth who are 5 through 7 years of • age on or before September 1, 2019, may enroll in a 4-H Cloverbud groups. Remember, it's not too late to invite your friends to join 4-H. We challenge each of you to share all the great benefits 4-H has to offer to your fellow peers.

Please remember that you can access 4-H online to add or remove projects. Refer to the Illinois 4-H Project Guide for all the great project opportunities available to you. There will be a cut off date of April 1 for adding projects minus those January 1 project deadlines of Beef Cattle and Dairy Steers. Be sure to keep your email and contact information up-to-date as well.

Youth may enroll any time during the year. However, we do have a fair exhibit eligibility deadline for youth to be eligible TO EXHIBIT AT THE FAIR of enrolled by April 1st.

YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS

The following species: dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats. All 4-H exhibitors (market and breeding) of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program **yearly** starting for the 2020 show season. Youth must either attend a face-to-face class or certify on-line via the website http://yqca.org The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18, and young adults 19-21. This certification is annual with test out options of 1-3 years. The estimated cost for the face-to-face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

**For 2020, Boone County will offer a few face-to-face trainings. Please watch for more information via email and/or the January-February 4-H Newsletter.

QUALITY ASSURANCE & ETHICS (QAEC):

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in **horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats**. Members must take the training whether they own a live animal or not. It is advised that they complete this one time as soon as they are enrolled in the project area. Counties will monitor completion of this. Failure to complete QAEC will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs. NOTE: Youth must be logged on to a computer for this program, either a desktop or laptop; not an iPad or iPhone. The program cannot capture the information for county staff to see when it is completed using iPads or iPhones.

Understanding copyright and trademark laws

When an author, musician, designer, or artist creates something, it is immediately protected by copyright or trademark laws and other people can't use it or create something similar. Original works such as stories, music, pictures, plays, dances, sculpture, movies, and architecture are protected. 4-H members should use caution when working on a speech, display, or exhibit so you don't use something that

doesn't belong to you.

4-H members can't draw or copy someone else's design, logo, words, or music without the permission of the original owner. That means, you can't draw a logo (such as Ford or John Deere) and use it on your exhibit. You can't create Mickey Mouse ears on your cake. You can't draw a Disney princess. You can't put SpongeBob image on your natural resource project exhibit board.

Think of it like this. You wouldn't take your neighbor's bike and ride it around to make your life easier without getting permission first. That would be stealing. When you take words, art, graphics, or photographs that aren't yours but use them like they are, that's stealing, too. Copying them from the internet is the same as stealing them unless you are using a site specifically created for free use of images.
