We are half way through April and well on our way to May, you know what means? Stephenson County 4-H Shows are 3 months away!!! There are several deadlines coming up that are very important to these shows.

1) Fair Entry will be opening up on May 16 and will be open till June 15. This is the part where you tell me in fair entry what projects/animals you will be bringing to the 4-H shows. Details on this will be coming the 2nd week of May.

2) YQCA Training– If you are showing beef, dairy, goats, sheep or swine you need to do your YQCA training BEFORE, June 1. This is a <u>yearly</u> requirement! Whether you do the training in-person OR online you must scan your certificate to me no later than June 1 at 4pm.

3) QAEC Training– If you are showing cat, dog, horse, rabbits/small pets, or poultry you must complete QAEC only <u>once in your 4-H career</u>. If you have shown these species of animals in the past you should already have completed this training. If you are not sure, please feel free to email me and ask. The deadline for QAEC is also June 1.

In this E-News I have included the links and details for both YQCA & QAEC trainings. Please do not wait till May 31 to complete these! We have had issues with these systems overloading in the past, due to high demand all at once, and it makes for a very bad day.

QAEC TRAININGS

Quality Assurance and Ethics Training— The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in horse, rabbit, poultry, dog, cavy (guinea pigs), and cat. Members must take the training whether they own a live animal or not. It is advised that they complete this as soon as they are enrolled in the project area. 4-H Members only have to complete a QAEC training once in their 4-H career, when showing a live animal or doing animal science with the above breeds.

Counties will monitor completion of this. Failure to complete QAEC will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs. The website is open year round at: https://web.extension.illinois.edu/gaec/

YQCA TRAINING

If you are a 4-H Member showing: **sheep, swine, dairy, goats, or beef** you will need to do your Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training again **BE-FORE the June 1 deadline**. This is for all members ages 8-18 showing livestock for a 4-H show.

1)**Online training** (there is a test at the end) and the cost is \$12, per student. Once completed please print 2 copies of your certificate— 1 needs to be given to the Extension office before June 1, and the other one travels with the 4-H member to the shows.

Whether you take the online course OR attend an in-person training, you MUST submit your certificate of completion to Brenda at the Extension office—NO LAT-ER than 4pm on June 1.
