

### **Shooting Sports Volunteers Needed**

Many young people don't have someone to show them how to safely handle a firearm or bow. Think back to the person who taught you to shoot. The Illinois 4-H program needs adults willing to serve as mentors and share their passion of shooting sports. Here's what you need to do:

- Contact your local Extension office and complete the required forms and background checks. The local office will complete your registration.
- Complete a 3-hour online training module at home.
- Attend a 9-hour hands-on field day which runs from 9 AM to 7 PM. Check your local office to see if assistance is available for the \$85 fee. Training dates for 2020 are:

Southern Illinois: Saturday, March 28 at Tombstone Gun Range, Marion. Register by March 18.

Western Illinois: Saturday, June 13 at Gardner Camp, Hull. Register by June 3.

Northern Illinois: Saturday, Sept. 12 at Torstenson Youth Education Center, Pecatonica. Register by September 2.

### Look for These Changes at the Illinois State Fair

With the timing of the state fair and the anticipated start of school, the 4-H General Project Show at the state fair has been condensed to three days: Aug. 14, 15, and 16.

- Exhibits must be in place by 9:30 AM and remain on display until 4 PM. (new release time)
- The awards will include **Champion Medals** for the highest score in each project class and **Reserve Medals** for the second highest score in each class. Cash premiums from the state will be paid to the medal winners. **Innovation Awards** will be given to exhibits judges find inspiring, innovative, or creative and are not based on scores. Medal winners cannot receive the innovation award in 2020.
- New projects at the state fair include: Child Development, Leather, Sports Nutrition, Family Heritage, and Shooting Sports
- The **State 4-H Public Speaking Contest** will be held at the same time as the state fair. Youth can compete in a speech and also bring a project to the General Project Show. Youth must be selected in their county contest to advance and will speak the same day as their county exhibit day.
- **Ewe lambs** are now eligible for the premier show.
- Steers advancing to state fair must be weighed by Feb. 29.
- The **junior poultry show** begins Monday, Aug. 17.
- The State 4-H Poultry Judging Contest will be held at the state fair on Monday, Aug. 17.
- The **junior rabbit show** begins Saturday, Aug. 22.

### You be the Judge at Illinois 4-H State Livestock Judging Contest

June 15 | 9 AM - 4 PM

Stock Pavilion | University of Illinois, Urbana

The Illinois 4-H Livestock Judging Contest will be held Monday, June 15 at the Stock Pavilion in Urbana (1402 West Pennsylvania Ave.) beginning with registration at 8:30 a.m. All participants must be checked in by 9:30. The contest will begin at 10. Each county may enter a total of three teams, with no more than two junior teams or two senior teams. Get all the rules and details online @ go.illinois.edu/4Hlivestock. There will be three classes of beef, three classes of swine and two classes of sheep. There may also be a class of meat goats substituted for one class of the other species. There will also be a class of 15 questions (5 from a beef class, 5 from a swine class and 5 from a sheep class). Cost for each senior competitor is \$10 to cover the cost of lunch. Juniors will be dismissed by lunch to get their own meals.

### State 4-H Shooting Sports Coordinators;

The National 4-H Shooting Sports Committee has had the 4-H Shooting Sports National Championships as well as the National 4-H Shooting Sports Teen Ambassador Training on our minds since the outbreak of COVID-19. Having given much thought and consideration to existing circumstances, the National Committee has made the decision to cancel the 2020 National Championships and to offer some form of Teen Ambassador Training in an online format. We are following the guidelines of the Center for Disease Control as well as the guiding principles issued by the National 4-H Program Leaders Working Group as rationale for our decision.

### Considerations include:

- The health and safety of our 4-H youth, families and volunteers is of highest priority.
- Information received from a survey of state 4-H shooting sports coordinators indicated that at least 10 states have travel restrictions through the entire summer
- Many of the 200 plus volunteers who typically assist with the Championships fall into the high risk category of severe implications from COVID-19
- Due to existing circumstances, many states are unable to conduct their state qualifying events prior to the time we had scheduled the 2020 National Championships
- · Current Stay at Home guidelines are affecting families financially
- If we were to hold the event, the quality of the experience would be diminished due to severely limited participation.

In regard to The National 4-H Shooting Sports Teen Ambassador Institute, many youth typically travel by air and to do this would put them at great risk. Additionally, the host campus site will likely remain closed throughout the summer. That said, there will be no face to face Teen Ambassador Training in 2020. If you are experiencing mild symptoms, please **DO NOT** go to your healthcare provider's office, FHN/Physicians Immediate Care or the Emergency Department. (If you are experiencing **severe** shortness of breath or another medical emergency, go to the Emergency Department.)

The supply of COVID-19 tests is still limited nationwide, so we must screen all callers. FHN's drive-through testing site is by appointment only: Individuals who arrive at the site without appointments will not be tested.

If you or a loved one has a fever and/or signs of lower respiratory illness (cough or shortness of breath; not symptoms of a typical cold or upper respiratory illness) AND meet any of the criteria below, you **may** be a candidate for COVID-19 testing.

- Any person, including healthcare workers, who has had close contact with a laboratory-confirmed COVID-19
  patient within 14 days of symptom onset
- A history of travel from affected geographic areas within 14 days of symptom onset (currently China, South Korea, Iran, Italy, parts of Europe, and Japan)
- From a congregate living or healthcare facility (staff and/or patient/resident) with clusters of infection not due to influenza and suspected to be due to COVID-19
- At higher risk for complications from COVID-19 and for whom rapid test results are more likely to impact clinical care/outcomes (adults age 65 years and older, people with chronic medical conditions and/or an immunocompromised state that may put them at higher risk for poor outcomes
- Other persons who have been evaluated by a medical professional and are deemed high priority, including hospitalized patients with unexplained pneumonia

Callers to the hotline will be asked screening questions about the criteria above. Answers to these questions will determine if you meet testing criteria and will provide direction for the next course of action, which may include testing at FHN's mobile location.

FHN's mobile test site is in the parking lot of the FHN Specialty Care – Harlem Avenue, 25 North Harlem Avenue (enter from Harlem Avenue) just north of FHN Memorial Hospital. Patients arriving for testing must present a photo ID upon arrival to confirm their appointment.

What to Expect: The COVID-19 test is a nasopharyngeal specimen swab, sometimes referred to as an NP swab or test. A long swab is inserted deep into the nasal cavity, often around 3 inches beyond where the nose attaches to the rest of the head, until the patient coughs.
