A Note About Fairs

We are excited to be in person this year for the county fairs! As we plan, we want to make sure that everyone is aware of the rules 4-H will need to follow to allow us to be together. These rules will apply only to the 4-H shows. The county shows have their own set of guidelines. During all 4-H shows (inside or outside):

- Masks must be worn by all members, volunteers and spectators.
- Social distancing practices should be followed according to health department guidelines.
- Building capacities will be based on current state guidelines. We may have to limit number of observers in the barn with priority given to immediate family.
- Hand sanitizer will be available in all show areas.
- We will not be requiring general projects to stay on the grounds. A schedule for general projects will be released closer to the fairs. For this year only, we encourage all general project participants to consider either entering their project in county open shows or following county project display options.

Livestock Edition



Horse lease/ownership/registration papers are due to the Extension Office by **May 1.** The papers must include color photos of both sides of the animal. Be sure to submit papers for any horse you *might* exhibit.



Youth for the Quality Care of Animals is still the **required** yearly ethics training for members enrolled in beef, goats, sheep & swine.

The training is available online at **yqca.org.** It is \$12 to take it online and there are Junior (8-11), Intermediate (12-14) & Senior (15-18) levels. To test out of an age division, you must be in the beginning year of the level - either 8, 12 or 15.



NOTE: We do not currently have access to the YQCA database to check certificate numbers. If you plan to show at State Fair, be sure to print a copy of your certification and keep with your files.

Quality Assurance and Ethics (QAEC) is required **ONCE** in a 4-H career for members enrolled in dogs, cats, small pets, horses, rabbits and poultry. It is free and can be found at: <u>Web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec</u>
