

Lee surrendered and ended the Civil War and two and a half years after President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation. We will again be attending Rock River Christian Camp, in Polo, Illinois. 4-H Day Camp will offer a variety of safely-led activities such as: archery, crate stacking, arts and crafts, hiking, zip-line, team building and large group games, as well as end each day with a camp evening program.

4-H Camp is open to a total of 100 youth each day that are between the ages 8-14 by June 14, 2022. Campers do not have to be a 4-H member to attend 4-H Camp. Youth may choose to attend, one, two or all three days for 4-H day camp. Camp runs from 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. with check-in and check-out procedures.

Winnebago County 4-H SHOWBOARD is holding its 10th Annual 4-H Fundraiser called the "4-H Summer Sizzler Sale". This fundraiser helps support the 4-H program in Winnebago County. Our hope is that each family will either purchase for themselves or sell at least 1-2 boxes to make this a successful fundraising event.

Please see the attached ad flyer and order form for information about what is included in each box of meat. The boxes sell for \$50 each. This really is a terrific value for all the different products in the box! All the meat products are locally grown and processed at Eickman's Processing in Seward, IL.

Members should begin taking orders now and collect the money at the time of order. Order forms and payments can be turned into the Extension office anytime between now and the end of the sale, but ALL ORDERS MUST be submitted by May 25, 2022. Checks should be made payable to "U OF I EXTENSION—Showboard" and meat boxes can be picked up on Saturday, June 11, 2022 from Noon until 1 pm at the Extension office—1040 North Second Street, Rockford.

Members are responsible for pick-up of their ordered boxes (or they may arrange to have the buyer pick up their own box). If the buyer would like to pick up his/her own box, please confirm the pick-up date and time with the buyer and make sure he/she knows your name and the 4-H Club you belong to. They will need to know this information in order to pick up their box. Please make a note of this on your order form when you turn it in.

Pick-up of boxes will be <u>Saturday—June 11, 2022 from Noon-1 pm at the Extension Office—1040 N. Second Street</u>. All orders need to be picked up at this time. All checks should made payable to <u>UOFI EXTENSION—Showboard</u>



Your Thoughts Matter Program for Illinois Teens

The topic of mental health has become widespread, but what does it really mean? What role should teens play in normalizing the conversation or helping others?

Teenagers especially need to know they can take charge of their well-being. Illinois Extension wants to help them maneuver the complexities of life, the different situations in which they may find themselves, and help them realize their potential in an online summer series called Your Thoughts Matter.

"Everyone is talking about mental health these days, and teens need to know how it affects all aspects of daily living," says Susan Sloop, Extension educator for 4-H and Youth Development. "They may think they know what mental health means, but it can be misunderstood just like any medical field."

Sloop will be leading the discussions for 13-18-year-olds on June 1, 8, 15, 22, 29, and July 6 from 3:30-4:30 p.m.

Your Thoughts Matter will teach teens definitions of common mental health disorders, the impact of mental health experiences, ways to help others, and resources available in their community.

This program is not a resource for those in crisis. If you or someone you know is struggling with a mental health issue, please seek adult or professional help immediately.
