- Fair Entries for Henry County are due by May 20.
- You register for the fair by going to fairentry.com. You cannot register for the fair via 4-H Online.
- Fairentry.com will be open for registrations on April 1.
- Log-in to fairentry.com using your
 4-H online email and password.
- If you forgot your password, reset it in **4-H Online NOT in Fair Entry.**
- If you forgot the email you use to log-in, contact the Extension Office.
- You can only register for project levels in which you are enrolled.

Speaking for Illinois 4-H program. Speaking for Illinois 4-H training is open to 4-H members who are 14 and older. Both will be all-day training experiences to prepare teens to support our local 4-H program by soliciting donors, speaking to community groups, and updating county boards or other community governing bodies about local 4-H impact. On a state level, those attending a training can register for 4-H Legislative Connection events at the State Capitol where they will tell their story to Illinois legislators. The registration cost is \$12.



Animal Ethics




For the 2019 fairs, Quality Assurance & Ethics testing will still be required for any 4-H youth enrolled in any animal project who haven't already completed the


course. The training can be found here: web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec. The deadline to complete this training is **May 1.**

YQCA-Youth for the Quality Care of Animals will not be required this year, but will most likely be a requirement for the 2019-2020 4-H year.

New Process

There will be no regional sheep and goat tattooing this year.

Instead, exhibitors planning to show at the state fair should follow this process for nomination.

For exhibitors *not* showing premiere:

- Get a nomination form from Jennifer/Extension office.
- 2. Take close-up photos of Scrapie tag in the ear of each of your nominated animals. Pictures must be clear and tags legible. Tag must be permanently affixed in ear.
- 3. Return completed nomination form and pictures to the Extension office for signature and submission to the state.



4. Nominations must be done between March 15 and May 15. They must be returned to Extension office prior to May 15!

For exhibitors showing Premiere:

1. Contact the Extension office to set-up a time to weigh and tattoo lambs between March 15 and May 15.

Premiere Swine

- Farrowed on or after
 February 10, 2019
- Barrows must be nominated, ear-notched, & tattooed by April 15.
- Must be tattooed before they are 35 days old and must not weigh more than 1 lb. per day of age.

IL 4-H Livestock Judging Contest

Cost: \$10 for seniors to cover cost of lunch.

Each county may enter a total of three teams, with no more than two junior or two senior teams. There will be three classes of beef, three classes of swine, and two classes of sheep. There may also be a class of meat goats substituted for one class of the other species. There will also be a class of 15 questions.

STPATE FAIR

SUPERIOR YOUNG PRODUCER

The Superior Young Producer Scholarship Program is offered by the Illinois State Fair to 4-H members in beef, sheep, swine, dairy, and horses. Three \$1,000 scholarships will be provided in horses, and three \$1,000 scholarships will be provided in dairy. A total of nine \$1,000 scholarships will be provided in a combined contest for beef, sheep, and swine contestants. The SYPA contest is open to 4-H members who are 14 years of age or older doing project work in the species area for which they are entering. Participants do not have to be exhibiting animals at the Illinois State Fair to participate in the SYPA contest. Check out the dates of each contest: Horse: July 24, Beef/Sheep/Swine: August 7, Dairy: August 17. The contest is supported by the Illinois 4-H Foundation and its sponsors.



State Poultry Judging

The Illinois 4-H State Poultry Judging Contest will be held Wednesday, August 7 immediately following the Poultry Show at about 4:30 p.m. in Building 105 of the State Fairgrounds. There is no limit to the number of exhibitors each county may send. Teams

of three or four contestants may be submitted. The four top seniors (age 14-18 on January 1, 2019) will compete as the Illinois team at the National 4-H Poultry and Egg Conference in November. Registration begins at 4 p.m. Check out the state 4-H website for all the details.

- * Open to all 4-H youth
- * Registration at 11 a.m.; Contest at Noon.
- * A judging card signed by Extension staff is required. Pick one up at your local office ahead of the contest.

Remember: Horse Ownership, Lease or Registration papers along with two color photos are due to the Extension office by **May 1.** State Fair horse entries are due to the State by **June 1.**

Gone Fishing

With the lake fully stocked, 4-H Fish Camp is back at 4-H Memorial Camp near Monticello.

Fishing begins at 10 a.m. Saturday, May 4 and lasts until 2 p.m. Sunday, May 5. Learn how to catch largemouth bass, crappie, bluegill, and channel catfish. Learn about fishing tips, lures, bait, equipment, knots, fish behavior, fish management, and fish cleaning. Each group registered will be assigned their own log cabin for lodging with single bunks. Participants must bring their own bedding and toiletries.

A fee of \$50 per person covers the complete program, lodging, boat, bait, and three buffet meals, including Saturday lunch and supper and a Sunday brunch. You'll also have fresh fish fillets to take home! Pre-registration and payment is required.
