

Great Learning Garden 4-H SPIN Club @ Wildlife Prairie Park Update April 2020



These are challenging times for us all, but our plans for the 2020 season continue in spirit, if not in deed. We enjoyed two meetings already in 2020, one in January, and one in February. In January we studied our moon and how the phases of the moon help gardeners. We learned which vegetables should be planted under the waxing or the waning of the moon. Our 4-H youth did some scientific experiments, and learned many fascinating things about our moon, and how important a role the moon has in our daily lives. We also created a large wooden moon in both the full stage, and a crescent phase, both of those will be displayed in our garden this summer. We created some rock meteor buddies to take home, which was fun. Then in February we studied the sun, our own personal star. We painted a giant sun, which turned out wonderful. The sun's rays create the energy in the plants in our garden. That large wooden sun displayed on our garden fence is going to remind us of how important the sun is in the growth of most of our plants, in our garden and everywhere.

We also studied the abilities of that amazing, but pesky creature the wild racoon. Our 4–H members created their own racoon bookmarks out of felt to take home at that meeting. Both meetings, as always, were full of laughs and good times along with our lessons. We have a truly dedicated group of 4–H youth members in our SPIN club, and our adult volunteers offer both their training and experience combined with their enthusiastic support of our youth members. Everyone is just as eager to pick up a hoe or pull some weeds, as they are to pick up a paint brush or enjoy the butterflies visiting our flowers.

So, for 2020 we still are planning, still are going forward with the amazing work that has been accomplished, and also being as confident as possible about the future. A new garden scale waits to be put into service, donated straw bales are standing ready to become garden bed material, and more art projects are on the way to compliment every corner of our garden. Meanwhile we plan to use online meetings for gardening lessons, and socializing in a safe manner. IMPORTANT! READ THIS for Animal projects

For youth enrolled in <u>Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goat</u> <u>and Dairy Cattle (</u>Showing live animals):

New statewide requirement is that members in these projects must complete YQCA – Youth for the Quality Care of Animals.

Must be done **EVERY YEAR (starting in 2020)** they are in the project. There are two options:

 Youth may attend one in-person training offered by the Extension Office. The training is one hour long.
<u>Pre-registration online is required</u>. \$3 per youth paid online ahead of time is required. If you are unable to pay online, ask the Extension Office for assistance.
Adults may attend with their kids, but do not register.
Adults may not be certified in this by attending, just youth. At this time a date for a June Peoria
County face to face training has not been set.

2. Youth may take training online individually at <u>http://yqca.org</u>. Cost for this is \$12 per youth.

Why? This program is being adopted as it is the nationally recognized, sanctioned, and accepted certification program for all national shows, and is a great education piece that supports 4-H market animal projects. It is the only quality assurance program accepted by packers that can replace PQA and BQA. It is felt that this is an important educational component to the 4-H projects involved.

For youth enrolled in <u>Horses</u>, <u>Rabbits, Poultry, Dogs and</u> <u>Cats</u> (Showing live animals)

The Quality Assurance and Ethics (QAE) training is still required for youth in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs and cats. You only need to take it once in your lifetime. If you have already taken this for one of the above animals, then you are covered. Those who don't complete the training will be removed from the project, and will not be eligible to exhibit at county shows. The website is open year round @ http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/.

NOTE: Youth must use a computer for this program; not a tablet or smartphone. **Youth in multiple species will be required to take both trainings when appropriate**. Examples: Dairy Cattle and Poultry means you would take YQCA for Dairy and QAE (if you've never taken it) for Poultry . Horses and Poultry means you only take QAE for both species.

NOTE: For any animal science display or poster projects – If a 4–H member is showing a poster or other display (not a live animal) at the 4–H General Show, they now do NOT have to do any type of ethics training. They can do it if they want to but are not required to. It is still a good learning experience.

An important update about State 4-H overnight programs


Camping is a valued part of the Illinois 4-H experience for thousands of kids every summer. Each year, we invest a great deal of effort in creating a camp experience that provides a fun, safe space for kids to learn and grow. With public health and safety as a pressing concern around the world right now, we have had to make some tough decisions in order to prioritize community health.

University of Illinois Extension has made the decision to cancel all summer camps sponsored or hosted by the university through July31. This decision applies to all overnight camps organized by Illinois 4-H such as: Memorial 4-H Camp in Monticello, the Illini Summer Academies and Citizenship Washington Focus

We're working to provide suggestions for alternate activities for campers and their families to safely participate in this summer. We look forward to planning a celebratory return to camping in summer 2021!

You be the judge at Illinois 4-H State Livestock Judging Contest

June 15 | 9 AM – 4 PM Stock Pavilion | University of Illinois, Urbana

Registration for this event is postponed and will be rescheduled pending updated COVID-19 information

The Illinois 4-H Livestock Judging Contest will be held Monday, June 15 at the Stock Pavilion in Urbana (1402 West Pennsylvania Ave.) beginning with registration at 8:30 a.m. All participants must be checked in by 9:30. The contest will begin at 10. Each county may enter a total of three teams, with no more than two junior teams or two senior teams. Get all the rules and details online @ go.illinois.edu/4Hlivestock. There will be three classes of beef, three classes of swine and two classes of sheep. There may also be a class of meat goats substituted for one class of the other species. There will also be a class of 15 questions (5 from a beef class, 5 from a swine class and 5 from a sheep class). Cost for each senior competitor is \$10 to cover the cost of lunch. Juniors will be dismissed by lunch to get their own meals.

4-H Poultry judging returns to state fair

August 17 | 4-6 PM Jr. Livestock Barns | Illinois State Fair

The Illinois 4–H State Poultry Judging Contest will be held from 4 to 6 PM Aug. 17 in the junior live– stock barns on the State Fairgrounds in Springfield. There is no limit to the number of exhibitors each county may send. Teams of three or four contest– ants may be submitted. The four top seniors (age 14 –18 on Jan. 1, 2020) will compete as the Illinois team at the National 4–H Poultry and Egg Conference in November. Registration begins at 3:30. - 3. Attend a 9-hour hands-on field day which runs from 9 AM to 7 PM. Check with the Extension office for assistance with the \$85 training fee. Training dates for 2020 are:
 - * Western Illinois: Saturday, June 13 at Gardner Camp, Hull. Register by June 3.
 - * Northern Illinois: Saturday, Sept. 12 at Torstenson Youth Education Center, Pecatonica. Register by September 2.
