ILLINOIS 4-H OUTLINES SAFETY REQUIREMENTS FOR IN-PERSON EVENTS

We're looking forward to the 2021 season! As Illinois 4-H staff plan for the 2021 show and event season, our top priority will continue to be the safety of all involved, combined with a commitment to creating positive youth development experiences for our 4-H members.

We are preparing for the possibility of returning to in-person events, based on local conditions at that time and in conjunction with current IDPH guidelines.

If current local conditions are conducive to in-person events, the opportunity for face-to-face judging for Monroe County will require that all participants, spectators, and volunteers adhere to Illinois 4-H event guidelines. We are counting on our 4-H members, their families, and our staff and volunteers to do their part to help make our upcoming events as safe as possible, whatever format they take.

The following COVID-19 social distancing and safety practices reflect requirements of the Illinois Department of Public Health and University of Illinois event guidelines. These mitigation protocols also may be modified to reflect any requirements of the local public health department based on local conditions at the time of the event.

1. **Face coverings are required for all youth, spectators, volunteers, and staff when within the defined 4-H event space (inside or outside).**
2. **Everyone in attendance will practice social distancing during the event, including maintaining six feet of separation (both indoors and outdoors) from those who are not in their households. To allow for social distancing, building and spectator capacity may be limited based on current public health department guidelines.**
3. **Handwashing and sanitizing stations will be provided throughout the venue.**
4. **Anyone who has experienced COVID-19 symptoms within the previous seven days is asked to stay home. COVID-19 symptoms include fever, cough, loss of taste or smell, or shortness of breath.**

If any of these guidelines presents a challenge for you, please contact us directly at 618-939-3434. We are happy to discuss what accommodations are possible so that we can look for ways that all youth can safely participate in this event.

As excited as we are about the possibility of stepping back into face-to-face judging, we also recognize that this is a continually evolving situation. Illinois 4-H reserves the right to adjust or cancel events in the case of identified risk, such as changes in local COVID conditions or known instances of non-compliance with safety guidelines.

We truly are stronger together. With your help, we look forward to a safe and successful summer!

ATTENTION LIVESTOCK MEMBERS!

IF YOU ARE ENROLLED IN DAIRY CATTLE, BEEF CATTLE, SWINE, SHEEP, AND/OR GOATS:

All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) program,

by attending class taught by local veterinarians.

There will be three local options for a face-to-face training:

- **April 26, 6:30pm, Monroe County Annex, 901 Illinois Ave., Waterloo**
- **May 6, 6:30pm, Monroe County Annex, 901 Illinois Ave., Waterloo**

There is a **\$3 fee** to YQCA to certify *each year* if you exhibit one of the above livestock species.

TO REGISTER:

- Go to <https://ygca.learngrow.io/Account/Login>
- Choose “Sign in with 4-H Online” and Illinois 4-H Youth Development.
 - Sign into your 4-H Online account.
- Select member that is enrolled in one of the above listed livestock projects.
- Choose the appropriate age and choose **“Instructor-Led Training.” \$3.00.**
- Choose Illinois and then the training you wish to attend, then click on the red “Purchase Course” button.
- Training must be paid for via credit card. If this option is not available for your family, please contact the Extension office as soon as possible.
- Repeat registration process with each family member required to take the training.

If you are unable to attend one of the face-to-face trainings, you may take the YQCA training online following the same directions as above, but selecting the online training for \$12. Please contact the Extension office if this is the option you are using. Please complete by June 1.

IF YOU ARE ENROLLED IN HORSES, RABBITS, POULTRY, DOGS, AND/OR CATS:

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for youth in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs and cats. You only need to take it once in your lifetime. Those who don’t complete the training will be removed from the animal science project and will not be eligible to exhibit at county fairs.

4-H & FFA LIVESTOCK AUCTION UPDATE

The Monroe County Extension & 4-H Education Foundation and the Youth Livestock Auction Committee are in the process of planning the 2021 Livestock Auction for local youth.

The group is exploring various options with the hope of a live auction; however, virtual plans are being considered if the need arises. One main consideration of the committee is being mindful of current economic conditions and the impact some of our local businesses have faced. We understand that some businesses and community members who have historically supported 4-H and FFA members in the past may not be in a financial position to participate in the auction this year.

With this in mind, the committee decided each youth will be limited to selling only one animal to reduce the total number of animals being auctioned this year.

We are working to plan 4-H livestock shows for the fair season taking into account COVID-19 social distancing and safety practices reflect requirements of the Illinois Department of Public Health and University of Illinois event guidelines (see page 2).

NEW IN 2021: Livestock exhibitors will now be paid premiums for TWO livestock entries per class number. Previous year rules allowed for exhibition of two entries per class, however, premiums were only paid for one entry.

4-H MEMORIAL CAMP, FAMILY CAMP RETREATS!

According to restrictions outlined in Phase 4 of the Restore Illinois Plan, we will not be able to hold our traditional Summer Youth Camps during the summer of 2021. We will, however, be holding 3 day/2 night **Family Camp Retreats** with each family getting their own cabin!

Activities: While at camp you can swim, boat, shoot archery, climb the rock wall, make arts & crafts, fish, take hayrack rides, participate in S.T.E.M. activities, hike, make s'mores over a camp fire and so much more! To meet COVID restrictions at activity areas, there will be sign-up sheets for all activities after participants arrive.

Meals: Meals will be served family style with each family getting their own table. Outside dining will be available and encouraged!

Required: At least one participant per family must be 4-H age (5-18 years old). COVID testing will be required of all participants at the gate to camp prior to entry for each session. If anyone in the family tests positive, the family will not be allowed to attend that session and a full refund will be given. We strongly encourage attendees to limit their activities with others outside their family for three days prior to their retreat. Masks and social distancing are required. Due to the nature of Family Camp, a parent or guardian must stay with their children for the duration of their camp session.

We can take up to 32 families with a maximum of 160 participants per session. The camp session must have at least 25 families (100 participants) per session in order for it to be held. If a session has to be cancelled, full refunds for that session will be given.
