4-H Fair Entry Opens

As the 4-H Fair quickly approaches and our 4-Hers have been putting in the hard work for their projects, make sure you have the opportunity to show off the outcomes of your dedication! Final project selections in Fair Entry can be made beginning May 21st through June 11th. Visit www.fairentry.com to complete your registration. Keep in mind, this is the final step to fine tune your selections that were made during initial enrollment. Everyone must complete this step to show at the 4-H Fair.

For example, when you enrolled in 4-H, you may have selected Cooking 101 as a project you wish to participate in. Fair Entry will require that you select which Cooking 101 project you will be bringing to the Fair such as Cereal Bars. Without completing registration in Fair Entry, you will not have an exhibit tag or be on the list for judging.



Please note the following changes due to the Health Department utilizing Building 1 & 2 for vaccines:

- Club booths, as well as Horticulture, Floriculture, and Crop projects will be located in Building 3 (formerly the Judging Hall).
- Restrooms will be available in the block building next to the Poultry barn and in the Beef Sale Barn.
- General Project Judging will take place in both the Hospitality Building and 4-H Food Stand.
- General Projects should enter from the East Gate. Please do not enter the South Gate due to Health Department vaccination clinics taking place.
- The 4-H Fair office will be located within the Bureau County Fair Office building. Please enter from the North door. **All General Project ribbons and trophies will be picked up here.**
- Federation will be creating and releasing videos to outline these changes as a reference.
- Everyone is encouraged to bring lawn chairs to enjoy your socially distanced time at the 4-H Fair!

Required Training for Animal Exhibitors

YQCA

All 4-H Youth with live market animal species projects in the following species are required to participate in either an in-person or online YQCA training:

- Swine (gilts & barrows)
- Sheep (wethers & ewes)
- Goats (meat & dairy)
- Beef Cattle (steers & heifers)
 Dairy Cattle

We are offering an in-person training on **Saturday**, **June 12th at IVCC from 10:00 am – 11:00 am**. In-Person training has a \$3 fee payable online at registration. If not paying online, please bring either a check or exact change day of training.

Pre-registration deadline is Friday, June 4th by visiting http://yqca.org and searching for our training at IVCC with Instructor Anne Scheel.

If this in-person date does not work, you can either attend a different in-person training offered at one of the following locations: https://yqca.learngrow.io/Training/Search

OR complete online at the cost of \$12 by visiting http://yqca.org. If opting to complete online, please make sure to print your certificate at completion to verify in the case that the training program does not correctly merge with 4-H Online 2.0.

For further clarification between the two programs please see below:

QUALITY ASSURANCE & ETHICS (QA&E):

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats. It is advised that they complete this one time as soon as they are enrolled in the project area. Counties will monitor completion of this. Failure to complete QA&E will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs. NOTE: Youth must be logged on to a computer for this program, either a desktop or laptop; not an iPad or iPhone. The program cannot capture the information for county staff to see when it is completed using iPads or iPhones.

YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS (YQCA)

The YQCA is a newer livestock quality assurance program that is replacing PQA which no longer exists. It also replaces the Quality Assurance & Ethics (QAEC) program for youth in the following species; dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats. All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program yearly. Youth must either attend a face to face class or certify online via the website http://yqca.org The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18, and young adults 19-21. This certification is annual with test out options of 1-3 years. Youth exhibiting swine at the Illinois State Fair and 4-H fairs are no longer required to be PQA plus certified. The estimated cost for the face to face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version.
