

Dear community leaders,

Helping area residents access healthy food options continues to be a priority for University of Illinois Extension. You will see in the pages of this quarterly report exactly how we are doing our part to meet several food insecurity challenges that are facing our communities.

SSM Health has been a valued partner to University of Illinois Extension. With their financial support supplementing our own grant resources, we successfully managed mobile markets from January through July across our five-county unit, serving 3,628 families. Our numerous community partners also provide invaluable resources such as market locations and volunteers. We could not do what we do without our partners and volunteers!

Our SNAP Education program staff hosted **15** Illinois Junior Chef cooking schools this summer, serving **97** children ages 8-13 years. Children learned how to safely prepare simple healthy meals with recipes containing ingredients easily accessible by most families. Many children were eager to apply the skills they learned at home for their families.

Our Master Gardener volunteers planted, maintained and harvested produce from two community gardens, one in Salem and one in Mt. Vernon. By the end of July, they had donated 319 pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables to local food pantries.

4-H members worked to address food access in their communities with a summer food drive:

- Clinton County 133 items; donated to Matthew 25 in Carlyle and BCMW
- Washington County **157** items; donated to Irvington Food Pantry
- Marion County 41 items; donated to Kinmundy Food Pantry

These numbers represent more than measurable objectives met; they represent real people whose lives are touched by the wonderful, selfless Extension employees, volunteers and partners like yourself. You help us help others do this every day... thank you.

Master Gardeners provide education at food pantries

As part of the Growing Together Illinois grant in Jefferson and Marion counties, the community gardens in Mt. Vernon and Salem have shared **319** pounds of fresh produce with food pantries in those communities. In an effort to support greater food access locally, Master Gardeners are also coordinating with our SNAP-Education staff to provide educational videos at area food pantries.

The first videos include how-to instructions on growing produce from seeds. In July these videos were viewed by approximately **136** people in three food pantries. In addition, Extension is providing pantry clients a starter pack with vegetable seed packets, a seed-starting container, step-by-step instructions, and coordinating recipes.



4-H Shows held face-to-face



Despite the challenges and setbacks of 2021, all area 4-H shows were held in person. This is due in large part to the flexibility of 4-H families and staff as we adjusted show dates and locations to meet CDC and University guidance.

Approximately **400** youth across five counties participated in various 4-H shows. More than **130** members exhibited their general projects in Springfield as Illinois State Fair delegates, and another **30+** headed to the Illinois State Fair with animal projects. Champion, Reserve Champion, and Inspire awards were plentiful among our local participants.

Among the special award recipients were Lauren Wolter and Shana Lueking from Clinton County. Both girls received \$1,000 scholarships through the Superior Young Producer program held annually at the State Fair.

Educational program offered with virtual and in-person options

Training offered by SNAP-Education Educator Ashley Hoffman each summer has become a relied-upon way for local school staff to receive their required continuing education credits. School staff had the option of going to the training held at Centralia High School or logging in online.

Forty-six participants received six continuing education credits, **11** online and **35** in person. A wide range of topics were covered, including Garden to Cafeteria: A Guide to Using Produce from the School Garden.



Illinois Junior Chefs

Illinois Nutrition Education Programs offered a series of kidfriendly cooking classes throughout the summer for youth ages 8-13. IJC is a great way for children to learn basic cooking skills while having fun!

IJC is offered through Illinois Extension's SNAP-Education program made possible by the USDA's Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program. Participants learn useful skills like reading a recipe, measuring and mixing ingredients, grating and peeling foods, using knives safely, juicing citrus fruits and cracking an egg. Each day included hands-on learning activities from a cookbook that students get to keep at the end of class. Almost 100 youth participated in the **15** sessions offered by local staff.





4-H Summer Food Challenge

The Summer Food Challenge kicked off in early June. It was designed to teach cooking and nutrition basics, while allowing youth to build confidence in the kitchen when there is no recipe to follow.

This activity lasted all summer with a virtual launch, three at-home family cooking sessions, and a finale at the end. Recipe Challenges featured wraps, pizza, stir fry, omelets and members choice.

Parents shared that youth were able to use food from their own garden, and the entire family got involved with "taste testing" family meals together.



Spring Fling goes virtual in 2021

This year's annual Spring Fling event was held as a weekly webinar series during the month of March. Each Thursday, plant and nature enthusiasts were treated to a different hourlong webinar, including landscape trees, the ages and stages of gardening, small fruits for the home garden, and growing herbs.

Following the live webinar, most of the sessions were uploaded to our YouTube channel, where they are growing in popularity. The Ages and Stages of Gardening video now has more than **100** views. 
