4-H GREEN COMMUNITIES TREE PROGRAM

Bureau County is looking for volunteers to help with planting a grouping of 25 oak trees at City County Park, Princeton with the goal of tackling global issues at the local level.

Carbon neutrality and nutrient runoff are complex issues facing our environment that can be combatted through planting new trees.

Illinois once held 14 million acres of trees, according to Sinclair. That number dropped to 3 million acres before intentional efforts 50 years ago began to reverse the decline. Today, Illinois has 5 million acres of trees.

In the spring of 2022, 4-H youth in Bureau county and 30 other counties throughout Illinois will each plant a grouping of 25 oak trees on public properties in their county. The groups, called savanna, will bring new life to oak-hickory forests currently under threat in Illinois.

Planting in Bureau County will take place April 2 at 10:00 am. A rain date is set for April 9th at 2:00 pm. Youth, adults, businesses, and other organizations that would like to participate in the planting process should contact Danielle Gapinski at 815-875-2878 or des85@illinois.edu

Cloverbuds created a canvas covered in tissue paper hearts. They all did a great job drawing, cutting, and adhering their delicate hearts.


February also brought flying dragons for the after school participants. Students created a dragon out of a toilet paper roll that they then made "fly" with strings.
