

Data Analyst

POSITION OVERVIEW

The Data Analyst serves as a regular, full time, 12-month position with primary responsibility for collecting, managing, and archiving data, creating and analyzing reports, creating custom reporting mechanisms, and sharing findings with various organizational units. This position will work with U of I Extension Units, program leaders, Director of Program Planning & Assessment, and others to understand existing and new reporting needs, define outreach metrics that measure community impact, and report quantitative data in meaningful and impactful ways, along with building upon established reporting metrics and, with our development team, create a new Data Warehouse and ongoing new data sets for future reporting.

One full time position is available **Location:** Urbana-Champaign Campus

This is a security-sensitive position. Comprehensive background checks, including but not limited to a criminal conviction information check, a CANTS check, and a review of the Registered Sex Offender list, will be conducted.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Build, customize and publish interactive reports, visualizations, and dashboards
- Create and maintain meaningful dashboards to support our Educator and Business Teams, marketing, deliver new insights, and enhance workflow Create action filters, parameters, and calculated sets for dashboards and worksheets.
- Create and maintain metadata and data dictionaries
- Oversee performance tuning and optimization to ensure interactive, accessible reporting for customer-facing employees
- Work with commercial, custom, and proprietary interfaces to build data reports
- · Develop conceptual designs of dashboards and other reporting solutions
- Work with internal stakeholders to understand reporting needs and deliver new data sets to support future reporting work with development team to define custom report delivery software
- Gather requirements, understand business and community impact, and define end deliverables
- Monitor performance and usage metrics of reporting to ensure quick access, accuracy of information, and relevance of all reporting
- Define requirements for data not currently available for reporting and Investigate the availability of data for reporting
- Utilize blended data from multiple sources to discover new visualization opportunities.
- Provide training with stakeholders on how to understand the data and transfer it to strategic information.
- Develop and improve Extension website analytics gathering, analysis, and reporting to stakeholders Support Web strategy with gathered data and provide training for understanding data
- Develop web analytics dashboards for internal Extension impact reporting by team or area.

REQUIRED:

 Two years of progressively more responsible work experience in an Information Technology (IT) related profession. - Master's degree in Information Management, Information Science, or related field.
- Education and/or Experience developing dashboards using data visualization tools.
- Education and/or Experience with web analytics and google analytics reporting with content strategy
- Education and/or Experience with processing data requests to solve technical problems for stakeholders
- Education and/or Experience closely working with diverse groups (ie. stakeholders, developers and student workers) in a team environment
- Education and/or Experience with Relational Database platforms such as SQL Server
- Minimum 2 years of related professional experience or higher education credits equivalent in data analytics.
- Experience creating marketing analytics reports, incorporating web, social media analytics, and CRM derived performance data.
- Experience determining Data Strategy to use, scheduling data refreshes, and creating efficiencies when dealing with large data sets.
- Experience writing complex calculations and parameters within Tableau.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

- Working knowledge of data cleaning using OpenRefine tool.
- Working knowledge of data analysis, modeling, data mining and reporting tools such as Weka, XPath, and Atlas.ti.
- Working knowledge of data coding language such as Python, R, Java or Datalog.
- Strong understanding of advanced Tableau features including calculated fields, parameters, table calculations, row-level security, joins, data blending, and dashboard actions
- · Knowledge of data warehousing concepts.
- Knowledge of Search Engine Optimization best practices and related web analytics tools and practices.

ENVIRONMENTAL DEMANDS:
