### **Design, Development and Support**

- Design and development of online courses for a variety of audiences including youth, volunteers, professionals and educators, using Articulate Storyline and other software to create and execute the online instruction.
- Collaborate with Extension Specialists and Educators, as well as faculty, to turn information into
  engaging online content with user friendly interface.
- Maintain and support U of I Extension online courses.
- Train and support staff in their use of instructional technology, including Moodle, Zoom, and similar platforms, as it applies to online learning.

- Evaluate software and technology for online educational use.

The position is a full-time, benefits-eligible, non-tenure academic professional position appointed on a 12-month service basis. Generous vacation and sick leave. State Universities Retirement System. Group health, dental, vision and life insurance.

Candidates with a Bachelor's degree in progress may be considered for interviews, but degree must be completed by hire date. One year of experience in online training and online program development. Experience with Articulate Storyline.

**Preferred:** Experience with project management. Experience with Moodle of other Learning Management Systems (LMS).

**Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:** Knowledge of audio/visual formats and equipment. Knowledge of curriculum development best practices and multilingual with educational content translation experience is preferred.
