- 1. A 4-H exhibitor can only show one cat or one kitten in the cat show. The same animal must be used for Showmanship Competition. The exhibitor must care for the cat (kitten) for at least three months before the end of the 4-H year (Aug. 31).
- 2. The divisions are as follows and member ages are as of September 1, 2019:
 - **a.** Pee Wee (ages 8-10)
 - **b.** Junior (ages 11-13)
 - c. Senior (ages 14 and up)
- **3.** Showmanship Grand Champion and Reserve Showmanship Grand Champion ribbons will be awarded based on answers provided on the Project Report and the video and/or photos uploaded.
- **4.** Project report must be filled out and submitted in Fair Entry: <u>https://extension.illinois.edu/sites/default/files/2020_4-h_project_report.pdf</u>
- 5. A video showing your cat and talking about your cat and the cat's care should be no more than 2 minutes. Instructions for uploading videos are here: <u>https://extension.illinois.edu/sites/default/files/how_to_upload_videos_to_box.pdf</u>
- **6.** Four photographs of your cat including front, side, rear and you with your cat should be uploaded into Fair Entry.
