- GUIDELINES:
- 1) Applicants must be a current member of a Cumberland County 4-H club for the 2021-2022 4-H year.
 - 2) Scholarship applications may only be submitted in **senior year of high school or freshman/sophomore year in college.**
 - 3) College freshmen and sophomores are eligible to apply if they did not receive a University of Illinois Extension Scholarship during a previous year.
 - 4) The application form and Letters of recommendation (one must be from a 4-H leader) must be returned to the Cumberland County Extension office by **October 3**.
 - 5) Proof of enrollment will be required prior to the distribution of scholarship checks.
 - 6) The application should be typed or printed neatly. Incomplete or illegible applications may not be reviewed.
 - 7) Parents and leader signatures are required.
 - 8) Scholarship will be awarded during the Cumberland County 4-H Achievement Program.

The Cumberland County 4-H Achievement Scholarship award is based on the following evaluation criteria:

Academic Achievement	25 points
Leadership	11 points
Community activities (including school and church)	15 points
