## **Completing Shelby County 4-H & Jr. Fair Entries**

There are two fairs being held during the Shelby County 4-H & Jr. Fair.

**Shelby County 4-H Fair** - During the 4-H Fair, members may receive A, B, & C ratings, State Fair delegate and alternate ribbons, Top Project ribbons and trophies. 4-H general projects are conference judged which means the 4-H member must be present for the judging. Judges will ask 4-H'ers a variety of questions such as how they made the project, what they like/dislike, what they would change if they had to make it again, etc.

**Shelby County Jr. Fair** - During the Jr. Fair, youth may receive 1-5 placings and champion ribbons. Junior fair judging is not conference judged. Entry tags are placed on projects and judges evaluate the project based on what they see and give placings.

### **Cloverbud Members:**

- Cloverbud members may bring up to 2 entries to display at the fair. Projects need to be in place in the 4-H Center on Sunday, July 18 between 4-8 p.m. Projects may be picked up at on Wednesday, July 21 at 9:30 p.m. or Thursday, July 22 between 8-9 a.m.
- Chit Chat with a Cloverbud is an exhibit opportunity for Cloverbuds to talk with older 4-H members about their projects and experience conference judging. Chit Chat is being planned for Wednesday, July 21 at 10 a.m. in the 4-H Center. A special award will be given to Cloverbuds who participate.
- Families may enter their 4-H projects in Fair Entry or complete a paper form. If you need a paper copy, please contact Yolanda.
- Cloverbud members may not participate in the Junior Fair.

### Misc. Items:

- Confirm the check-in time and judging time of each project area.
  - During the fair, check-in times vary between the 4-H Center and Produce Building. Don't assume everything is at the same time.
  - READ YOUR FAIRBOOK!
- Confirm your projects have met all the requirements listed in the fair book! Several projects require the 4-H'er to submit a report listing the steps they took to make their project.
- Livestock all health papers are to be checked in at the fair office on Sunday, July 18 from 7-8 p.m.
- All livestock exhibitors must have their entries in place by Sunday, July 18 at 8 p.m. No entries shall be removed until Wednesday, July 21 at 9:30 p.m. Any exhibitor failing to comply with the above rules will forfeit their premiums won during the fair.
- If you are unable to attend the face to face judging, the 4-H member must complete the Shelby County 4-H Absentee Waiver Form by July 1 and submit the form to the Extension office. If approved, the 4-H member must complete the Shelby County 4-H Absentee Judging Form and submit it with their project. The project must be at the fair at the designated check-in time and will be judged during the designated judging time. The project will not be eligible to be selected for the State Fair.

- Shelby County 4-H Entries The deadline is June 4.
- 4-H members will receive their fair book from their club leader. The leader will give the 4-H member a listing of the projects they enrolled in 4H Online by April 1.
- 4-H members must complete their 4-H entries in the online Fair Entry program. In order to do this, families must know their 4H Online log-in. If you do not remember your password, log-in to 4H Online, select "Reset password" and a link will be sent to the email that you have listed.

- Families were sent an email with the Fair Entry Instructions which will walk 4-H'ers through the entry process. When you have completed your entries, make sure you click the **submit button**. Once you have submitted entries, families will not be able to add additional entries until the entries have been approved.

- The fair book will list the specific details for the project requirements. Some 4-H general projects will have additional classes listed such as Ready4Life and the innovation class. A 4-H member may only exhibit in **one** of the classes; either the specific project class, Ready4Life, Innovation or the Maker class.
  - Example: 4-H Geology (page 94 in the fair book)
    - The following are classes available for 4-H Geology: Pebble Pups 1, Pebble Pups 2, Rock Hounds 1, Rock Hounds 2, Geology Innovation, Ready4Life and Maker. A member may only pick one class as their exhibit.
    - If a 4-H member shows up with more than one project, they will have to choose the project they wish to exhibit.
- Mark the classes you enter in your fair book, so you know which projects you signed up for.
- For livestock classes only 1 entry is allowed per class:
  - 4-H'ers must sign up for showmanship classes. Showmanship is considered a separate division under each species.
  - Beef If you are bringing only one animal in a project area, select class 1. For example: if you are bringing 1 Angus heifer select Angus Heifer class 1. If you are bringing more than one entry, start at class 1, then class 2, etc.
    - Market animals Don't forget to sign up for the Rate of Gain class.
  - Dairy You may enter up to 9 classes. Start at class 1, then class 2, etc.
  - Sheep You may bring up to 2 breeds. You would select the class name and then class 1 and if you are bringing 2 entries, then select class 2.
  - Swine Each exhibitor is limited 6 animals, at least 2 must be purebred. Otherwise, 2 gilts and 2 barrows. Start at class 1 and then class 2, etc.
- If you aren't sure that you will get your project done, you should sign up. You cannot add projects after the June 4 deadline.

### Shelby County Jr. Fair Entries

- There is no cost to participate in the Junior Fair. Any entry fees will be deducted from the premiums paid out.
- Each person exhibiting in the Jr. Fair needs to complete an exhibitor card.
- The Jr. Fair entry sheets are on yellow paper. The Jr. Fair entry forms correspond to the yellow colored pages in the fair book pages 17-48.
- Mark the classes you enter in your fair book or make copies of your entries so you know what you have signed up to bring to the fair.
- Each project area needs to have an entry form.
  - Example: Woodworking and welding would go on separate forms.
- Jr. Fair entries are open to youth enrolled in a Shelby County 4-H Club or who live in Shelby County. The exhibitor must be 8 years of age as of September 1, 2020.
- Youth can submit Jr. Fair entries for any project areas. Youth do not have to be enrolled in a corresponding 4-H project.
  - Example: A 4-H'er is only enrolled in Cooking 101. For the Jr. Fair, they could complete Jr. Fair entries for any Jr. Fair project area such as gardening, photography, arts & crafts, rabbits, etc.
- Exhibitors need to complete one Junior Fair Exhibitor Card.
  - Complete your name and age as of September 1, 2020 at the bottom of the form. Jr. Fair classes are split by 4-H age, which is based on September 1.
- When filling out the Jr. Fair entry form for all livestock, rabbits and poultry:
  - It is very important to list the number of head and the number of cages/pens you will need.
  - List the class #, class name and the breed and complete birthdate including year.
  - DO NOT SIGN UP FOR THE CHAMPION CLASSES. Champion classes are listed so that winners can be paid for the class.
  - Jr. entry forms for horses List each horse on a separate form or list the name of each horse in the Livestock information breed column.
- Misc. general projects:
  - List the first number of the class if there is a series of classes. Example: 910-914 are woodworking classes. On your entry form, you would list 910.
  - DO NOT SIGN UP FOR THE CHAMPION CLASSES. Champion classes are listed so that winners can be paid for the class.
  - If you aren't sure that you will get your project done, you should sign up. You cannot add projects after the June 3 deadline.
- Verifying your entries before submitting them to your leader/Extension office.
  - The fair book has a table of contents on page 4 and 5. Most all 4-H entries have a corresponding Jr. Fair entry. If there is a page number listed for 4-H and the Jr. Fair, then your project can be exhibited in both fairs. If you have signed up for a 4-H project, verify that you have also completed a Jr. Fair entry for that same project area. We do not want youth to miss out on a judging opportunity.
    - Example: 4-H Geology (page 92-93), the corresponding entry for the Jr. Fair would be Class 801 (page 39).

- 4-H projects without a Jr. Fair class: Bicycle, Cats, Child Development, Civic Engagement, Collectibles, College & Career readiness, Communications, Consumer Education, Drones, esports, 4-H Exploratory, Family Heritage, Health, Intercultural, Leadership, Plants & Soils, Reading, Small pets/guinea pigs, Technologies, Theatre Arts, Weather, and Video/Filmmaking
- Entries are due into the Extension office by June 4.

#### IL State Fair Entries:

- Horses and Livestock **do not** have to qualify at the Shelby County 4-H Fair to exhibit at the State Fair. It is the **4-H'ers responsibility** to complete state fair entries for horses and/or livestock. Only General Projects must qualify to exhibit at the State Fair.
- Horses –State Fair entry forms must be signed by Shelby County 4-H Staff and postmarked by June 1.
- Livestock State fair entry forms must be signed by Shelby County 4-H Staff and postmarked by July 15.
