



We are pleased to report that the collaboration between the University of Illinois Extension SNAP Ed Program and Master Gardener Program as well as the HSHS Good Shepherd Mission Team was verv successful in 2021.

FEEDS FAMILIES!

Early in March the Garden received a grant from Farm Credit of Illinois in the amount of \$500 to purchase mushroom compost to fill newly built raised beds at the new garden plot south of HSHS Good Shepherd Hospital in Shelbyville. The Community Garden board also wrote a grant to the Lumpkin Foundation and received \$5000 to build 10 raised beds, move the existing garden shed and run a water source to the new garden. Recently we were awarded a grant from the San Damiano Outreach committee (HSHS Missions) in the amount of \$4000.

For Spring planting, we harvested radishes, onions and beets. Our summer planting included a variety of peppers, summer squash, tomatoes and zucchini. We also did a late summer planting of bok choy. All of the produce was donated to Shelbyville United Methodist Church food pantry, Shelbyville Senior Center and the Towers housing site. Total produce donation pounds this year were 662.31. Master Gardeners also provided a class to the Shelby County Cloverbuds on plant care and growing tomatoes. Some of these Cloverbud tomatoes were shown at the Shelby County 4-H and Junior Fair in July.

Plans for the winter include using a portion of the hospital grant to place a "Blessing Box" on the campus at the hospital. This little food pantry is being built by Shelbyville High School Industrial Arts class. The little pantry will be maintained and supported by the hospital, Methodist Food Pantry and University of Illinois Extension. In addition to basic nonperishable items, the Blessing Box will be stocked with fresh produce from our community garden. We also are in the process of building 10 new raised beds with the hope of doubling our production next year.
