Shelby County 4-H

Shelby County 4-H had 373 4-H members (including Cloverbuds) enrolled in 2021-2022. There are 45 club leaders who share their knowledge and love of 4-H with its members. Our 4-H program continues to grow because of the continued recruitment by 4-H members, participating in parades, trunk or treats, workshops and by all the families sharing their great experiences.

Shelby County 4-H has 13 community clubs, 5 SPIN Clubs, and 2 Cloverbud Clubs. The Scrap O'Maniacs was a new paper crafting SPIN Club. They had six member who met on a monthly basis and learned a variety of card making and scrapbooking techniques. The club was led by Dianna Furr and Debora Fogleman. Spark Shooters members were back in action learning the basics of programming Legobotics Mindstorms Robots. This SPIN Club is led by Jim Sparks.

Highlights from the year included 23 workshops that helped 4-H'ers learn more about projects and increase their knowledge. Craft day workshops, the Fall Round-Up and 4-H Fire-Up were led by Federation members, which let them use and enhance their leadership skills. We sponsored 3 Cloverbud only workshops.

Shelby County 4-H Federation offered three unit wide photography contests that offered cash prizes. They saw a need to include more unit activities so that members would have more experiences on their year-end awards. Shelby County 4-H had a total of 68 entries participate in the various photography contests. Unit 19 which serves Coles, Cumberland, Moultrie, Douglas and Shelby Counties had a unit wide officer training in Mattoon in January.

There were 231 Shelby County 4-H members who exhibited at the Shelby County 4-H Fair, with a total of 1,454 exhibits. 51 Cloverbud members participated in the fair with 88 exhibits. 38 Cloverbuds came to Chit Chat with a Cloverbud and shared their projects with older 4-H members. At the IL State Fair General Projects Show, there were 48 members that exhibited with 11 awarded champion, 5 awarded reserve and 5 awarded Inspire Awards. Shelby County 4-H livestock exhibitors also placed well in the livestock shows.

Thank you to the 4-H leaders who continuously work to make Shelby County 4-H Clubs strong with their community service work, leadership and public speaking opportunities. Our leaders are the heart of Shelby County 4-H and we couldn't do it without them.

Thank you to all the 4-H members and families for making 2021-2022 another great year in Shelby County 4-H!



Illinois 4-H Experience Award

Illinois 4-H challenges youth to try new things, experiment in project areas they may enjoy and explore opportunities around the state and country. This is the sixth year for the Illinois 4-H Experience Recognition award. The Experience Award offers recognition for members who participate in activities and events.

The award is based on four dimensions of experience: Participation, Community Service, Leadership and Project learning. The Bronze level award requires members meet 1 experience in each of the four dimensions. The Silver level award requires members meet 2 experiences in each of the four dimensions with at least two of those being at the county level or above. The Gold level award requires members to complete 4 experiences in each of the four dimensions with at least 2 of those experiences beyond the county level.

This is the sixth year Shelby County 4-H members have participated in this awards program. There were a total of 44 applications as well as three that were sent to the State 4-H Office for judging. We had 10 more applicants than 2021 which shows our members are continuing to grow in their 4-H experiences.

Federation Projects

Shelby County 4-H Federation members were hard at work over the past year. Members assisted with multiple craft days, 4-H Fire-up, Cloverbud Fire-Up, 4-H week activities, worked the 4-H BBQ, were Cloverbud judges at the fair and kept the pop stand full of cold drinks.

Members packed 325 harvest bags which were delivered to Shelby County grain elevators. They also worked with Pat Garlick and packed over 50 Pride Packages that were sent overseas to the troops. Many worked the Festival of Lights donation booth as well as Shelbyville Food Distributions.

Members applied for an IL State Food Advocacy Grant and received \$1,000. Their grant was to purchase kid friendly food and put together 110 backpacks for Head Start and Project Help students in Shelby County. Federation used \$925 of the grant to purchase food and \$75 to purchase crayons. Federation members wanted to include fun learning activities for the kids. Members made popsicle puzzles, provided a 4-H coloring book and a scavenger hunt was included in the backpacks. Teachers from all three programs said the smiles in the photos says it all “ The kids loved the backpacks!”

4-H Clubs in action!

During the 2021-2022 4-H year, Shelby County 4-H clubs were challenged by Federation to do a variety of community service projects as well as bring fun and learning to their club meetings. There were seven clubs that met the goal of completing at least five out of eight activities. Here are a few highlights of all the great work being done by 4-H Clubs and their members. To say Shelby County 4-H has been a bit busy, is an understatement. Great job to everyone for their hard work and great efforts.

Coldspring Copperheads Club members wrote thank you cards to soldiers, delivered Sunshine Boxes to 4-H volunteers, made May baskets for elderly neighbors. They also played ice breaker games to add fun to their meetings.

Findlay Feeders members made Easter cards which were given to the Easter Pride Packages boxes.

Ful-O-Pep members went shopping for Angel Tree recipients and nursing home residents. They made Valentines for Villas of Holly Brook residents, crafts were made and delivered to neighbors and worked at the Sunken Garden in the Spring. They also had the Shelby Dive Team come talk about their services.

John Jordan Jaybirds members made cards for veterans, along with cards and ornaments for Shelbyville Manor. They made Valentines for the nursing home.

Moweaqua Rustlers members created thank you cards for the troops and went shopping for Kemmerer Village kids. In February, they delivered Valentine cards to the nursing home. They also did hands on learning activities during club meetings creating mini greenhouses and building Can Can Robots. They also were in the Pow Wow Parade promoting 4-H.

Oconee Eager Beavers were busy collecting non-perishable food items for the Oconee Food Pantry. In October, they painted pumpkins for nursing home residents and wrote thank you cards to the veterans. Several members could be seen in the Santa Parade in Pana. They created Valentine cards for Heritage Health in Pana and made spring crafts for the nursing home. Members also participated in a variety of workshops held at club meetings.

Rural Feeders club members cleaned the park in downtown Assumption as well as picked up trash in the spring. They assisted in packing food baskets for families in Assumption at Christmas. They were also in the Assumption Fest parade promoting 4-H.

Shelby Showstoppers members went shopping for a Kemmerer Village youth, worked the Festival of Lights, assisted in the Blessings in a Backpack program in Shelbyville and potted flowers for the residents of the Villas of Holly Brook.

During Christmas, Shelby Sparklers decorated veterans memorials in Sigel. They also created appreciation snack baskets for Back the Blue. In the Spring, they planted flowers at the Veterans wall in Sigel. They also set up a 4-H display at Heartland Nursing Home.

Silver Spurs made Christmas cards for the troops, went Angel tree shopping for youth in Tower Hill and worked the Festival of Lights. In the spring, Easter cards were given to the Pride Packages boxes.

Strasburg Tailtwisters made Easter cards for the Pride Packages Easter boxes.

At the county level, 4-H members donated 250 hats and gloves which were delivered to local schools and the Pana Community Mission Center. In the spring, over 600 items were donated to the Easter Pride Package boxes headed to troops stationed overseas. In December, we had 14 members attend the first ever Community Service Workshop. Members made over 50 crafts which were delivered to the Hawthorne Inn, Shelbyville Rehab and Shelbyville Peace meals.
