Are you enrolled in ZSuites?

April 1 deadline!

All youth must be enrolled in ZSuites by April 1 in order to exhibit at the Shelby County 4-H Fair. Enrollment can be completed through this link: https://4h.zsuite.org/ Club leaders have instructions for you. If your club pays your 4-H'ers program fee, then select the payment by check option. If your club doesn't pay the fee, families can pay by credit card or select payment by check and give your payment to your club leader or drop it by the Extension office. If you have more than 3 children, select the payment by check so that the 4th child discount can be applied to your account. Youth must be enrolled in and approved in ZSuites before attending any 4-H workshops, programs, etc. Please let Yolanda know if you have any questions.

4-H Camp Scholarship Opportunities

There are two scholarship opportunities for Shelby County 4-H members who are planning to attend 4-H Camp this summer. Shelby County 4-H Federation offers a \$50 scholarship. 4-H members must complete the Federation scholarship form located on the website https:// extension.illinois.edu/sites/default/files/ ccdmsfederationactivityscholarshipform.pdf or contact Yolanda to receive a copy.

Shelby Extension Foundation offers 4-H'ers a \$30 scholarship. Members can write a short essay about why they would like to attend 4-H Camp or may create a poster about why they are looking forward to going to 4-H Camp. Essays, posters and scholarship forms are due into the Extension office by June 5. Scholarships will be reimbursed after the 4-H member has attended camp. Questions - contact Yolanda.

Little Roots Gardening Program

While the weather is still cold and dreary, warmer days are ahead and it's time to start planning for summer. The Little Roots Gardening Program is open to Cloverbud members and the fee is covered by the Shelby County Extension Office. The Little Roots Gardening program provides a gardening calendar for youth to engage in activities from May through September. Youth will explore pollination and insects, weather, a plant life cycle and plant care. Each youth that signs up will receive a calendar, and seeds/plants for 7 plants/flowers and gardening resources sometime in May. Cloverbuds will be able to display up to 2 of their plants/flowers at the fair in July.

The <u>Illinois 4-H Alumni</u> <u>Awards</u> program will recognize alumni for their individual achievements, contributions to their industry or profession, service to the community, and loyalty to the Illinois 4-H program.

Illinois 4-H Alumni Award

Established in 1981

The highest honor bestowed upon a 4-H alumnus by the Illinois 4-H Association and Illinois 4-H program on behalf of the University of Illinois. This award recognizes an elite group of Illinois 4-H alumni for their outstanding career accomplishments and leadership in civic, community, and professional activities.

4-H Young Alumni Award Established in 2023

The Young Alumni award is bestowed upon alumni by the Illinois 4-H Alumni Association and Illinois 4-H program on behalf of the University of Illinois. This award recognizes a young alumnus that has demonstrated significant accomplishments and is an emerging leader in their professional or civic contributions to their community. They have proven to be ambassadors for the Illinois 4-H program and the 4-H young alumni community.

IL 4-H Family Spirit Award

Established in 2002

The Illinois 4-H Family Spirit award recognizes an Illinois 4-H family who has substantially benefited from and continues to advocate for the Illinois 4-H program over at least three generations. This award is presented to the family on behalf of the Illinois 4-H Alumni Association and Illinois 4-H program on behalf of the University of Illinois.

Previously, the Illinois 4-H Alumni award and the Illinois 4-H Family Spirit awards were established and presented by the Illinois 4-H Foundation. The Illinois 4-H Alumni award was discontinued in 2015. The Illinois 4-H Alumni Association will work with the Illinois State 4-H Office to continue these awards.
