New this year General Projects Silent Auction

Wednesday, July 20

Shelby County 4-H is excited to offer a Silent Auction for some of our general projects this year. The Silent Auction will be run from 5-8 p.m. on Wednesday, July 20.

General Project exhibits in the areas of interior design, photography, woodworking, welding, and select visual arts projects will be selected by judges to participate in the silent auction. We plan to have 5-10 projects in the auction. 4-H'ers will complete the silent auction form stating they will or will not sell their project so alternates can be contacted. Those wishing to participate will be able to set a minimum selling price. Bidding will be done in increments of \$5. The bidding will end at 8 p.m. and the final names listed will be the winners of the auction. Checks will be made out to the 4-H member.

If the project was selected as a state fair project, members will need to state this on their entry and will receive payment once they have delivered the item to the buyer.

Please share with friends and family so they can come out and support our general projects kids.

We are going to pilot the silent auction this year and hope to make it bigger in 2023.

Poultry Exhibitors

The Illinois Department of Agriculture recently extended the ban on exhibiting poultry through the rest of the summer fair season. Shelby County 4-H is offering 4-H members the opportunity to exhibit their poultry projects via a Virtual Show or through a general animal science project area.

<u>In-person Judging – Wednesday, July 20, 9:30 a.m.</u>

- In person 4-H'ers may exhibit market eggs in both the 4-H and Junior Fair on Wednesday, July 20 at 9:30.
- Showmanship will be held following the market egg classes. These classes will be in-person. The judge will talk with each 4-H'er about their poultry project. Questions will include general knowledge of the poultry industry, breed standards and which breed(s) of poultry they prefer.
- Awards and 4-H ribbons will be presented for all poultry classes at the conclusion of the showmanship judging. We will also be awarding an Outstanding Exhibitor award. This will be evaluated through attendance at clean-up, through videos and through the poultry show.

<u>Meat Pens</u> – If you are planning to exhibit a meat pen, please contact Poultry Superintendent Sherri Hudson at 217-259-5816 to coordinate a time for her to come and weigh your birds. Sherri will plan on weighing birds the week of July 11. The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion meat pens may be allowed to participate in the Youth Livestock Auction. The 4-H'er must be present and will display their winning banner. Live birds will not be allowed to be at the fair.

Animal Science Option - 4-H members may select to participate in a general animal science project area. This would require members to prepare a display focusing on any activity related to the animal science project. Demonstrate skills and knowledge you have gained through the animal project you studied. Choose whatever method best shows what you've learned. All exhibits must include something visual, such as a printed copy of a digital presentation, which will remain on display during the exhibition. If you wish to participate with an animal science poster for poultry, contact Yolanda at nation2@illinois.edu or by calling the Extension office at 217-774-9546 by Wednesday, July 6.

<u>Virtual Show Option -</u> 4-H members may only create and upload videos for entries they completed by June 3 in Fair Entry. Upload all videos by July 10. Videos will be uploaded to https://go.illinois.edu/Shelby4HPoultry2022

Be sure to include exhibitor information on the beginning of each video.

State Fair General Projects

4-H general projects must qualify at the Shelby County 4-H Fair in order to exhibit at the IL State Fair. Those who qualify will need to complete paperwork at the fair and turn in by Wednesday, July 20. 4-H members may only take one project to the State Fair. If you are a multiple State Fair winner, please note on the form which project you would like to take so that alternate exhibitors may be contacted.

Shelby County 4-H day at the State Fair is Saturday, August 13.

Exhibitors 12 and under get in free at the State Fair. Exhibitors 13-18 years of age will receive a free ticket. Adults 18-59 can purchase discounted tickets for \$5.

Tickets can be picked up at the Shelby County Extension Office.

Shelby County Youth Livestock Auction

6:30 p.m. Wednesday, July 20

THE SHELBY COUNTY JR. FAIR BOARD IS IN CHARGE OF THE AUCTION. The 2022 Shelby County Youth Livestock Auction will be a non-terminal sale. All auction items will sell by the head/pen. What does this mean to 4-H families? The 4-H member will retain ownership of their animal following the auction and will receive a premium from the buyer. The 4-H member is responsible for taking their animal home. The successful buyer will not take ownership of the animal. Arrangements for purchasing the animal are strictly between the buyer and the seller after the auction has concluded.

Please be advised that while the Jr. Fair Board promotes the auction thru advertising, personal contact and mailing over 200 letters to prospective buyers, we need help. Exhibitors should try to secure prospective bidders for their animals in the auction. Parents and participants please contact your banker, insurance agent, etc. and ask them to attend the auction. The auction showcases all the hard work and effort by 4-H'ers. Businesses can not possibly purchase from all their customers but it is important for them to be invited and welcomed to the auction.

Tips and Tricks for the Fair

- 1. Read your fair book! Note: 4-H Foods and 4-H Photography has been moved to Saturday, July 16. Check in from 8-9 a.m. at the 4-H Center, judging starts at 9 a.m.
- 2. Give yourself time to complete your projects. Don't wait until the last minute.
- 3. Read your fair book for check-in times! Most projects and all animals need to be on the fairgrounds Sunday, July 17 by 8 p.m. Animals will be released on Wednesday, July 20 at 9:30 p.m. 4-H Center and Produce Building projects will be released at 9 p.m.
- 4. 4-H Photography projects All photos must be accompanied by details of the camera settings. Read page 98. Photo Editing projects must include a print of the original photo.
- 5. 4-H Foods projects All food entries must include the recipe from the cooking project book (101, 201, 301, 401) and menu plan. Read requirements for each project.
- 6. Cloverbud Projects Little Roots entries need to be checked in at the Produce Building from 5-8 p.m. All other Cloverbud entries can be checked in at the 4-H Center from 5-8 p.m.
- 7. Market animals check the fair book for your weigh-in times.
- 8. All 4-H projects are conference judged meaning that 4-H members will meet and discuss their project with the judge.
- 9. Everyone is here to help! Ask questions. Each building and livestock has a superintendent that will help 4-H'ers with any questions. The fair office always has someone there to help as well.
- 10. Have fun and enjoy the fair!

Youth selling in the auction

4-H'ers will have their picture taken before they enter the sale ring. This way all 4-H'ers have had a picture taken to send to their buyer after the auction.

After the auction is over, if the buyer would like a picture with their seller, 4-H'ers can have another picture taken.

A few weeks after the fair, pictures will be available at the Extension office. 4-H'ers will receive a copy of the picture for them to keep and one to give to their buyer.

4-H'ers need to pick up their picture and take them to their buyer. Buyers display the pictures in their businesses so it is very important to get the pictures picked up quickly and delivered. Watch the Shelby County IL 4-H Facebook page for updates.
