4-H challenges youth to submit their best shot

This latest photography challenge, sponsored by Minnesota 4-H, is open to youth across the Midwest. Youth are encouraged to use their photography skills and creativity to capture their best shot.

Youth as young as kindergarten are welcome to join the challenge. This is a great first experience for people who are new to 4-H. Learn more and register for the "Hit Me with Your Best Shot" photo contest on the Minnesota 4-H photography webpage: <u>"Hit me with your best</u> <u>shot" 4-H photo contest | UMN</u> <u>Extension</u>

Once registered for the challenge, youth can experiment with photography elements to create stunning photographs. On-demand lessons are available on the Minnesota 4-H photography project page, including how angles, light and composition could enhance your photography.

Youth may submit their favorite photo (with no or minimal editing) with up to three sentences of why it's special to them.

Deadline to submit an image is 11:59 p.m. on March 31, 2022. Volunteer 4-H photography judges will review all submissions, provide feedback and select the top images for special awards. All submissions will be entered into a prize drawing. Submitted images will be featured in a digital slideshow shared with participants and posted on Minnesota 4-H's Facebook and YouTube channels.

April 23 (Saturday) – 4-H Fire-Up will be held at the 4-H Center at 9 a.m. This event is free and open to 1^{st} and 2^{nd} year members. Cloverbuds may attend with a parent. There will be limited space so sign-up soon! We have some great projects planned for the morning.

April 24 (Sunday) – Federation will be sponsoring the annual skating party at Silver Stars Skating Rink in Mattoon. Skating will be held from 5-8. There will be a \$1 charge for those needing skates. Families may bring in their own food and drink as there is no longer a concession stand. 4-H'ers are also asked to thank their club leader or 4-H volunteer by sending a card, texting, calling, etc.

April 25 (Monday) – Window displays need to be in place by 9 a.m. Leaders need to notify Yolanda with the location of the display.

April 26 (Tuesday) – Wear your 4-H t-shirt to school day. Send a photo to Yolanda on this day and receive a free candy bar.

April 27 (Wednesday) – Community Service Day - Clubs who do a community service project during 4-H week will receive \$20 from Federation.

April 28 (Thursday) – 6:30 p.m. 4-H Scavenger Hunt at the Shelby County Junior Fairgrounds – more details to follow in upcoming newsletters.

April 29 (Friday) – Shelby County 4-H Family Carnival - 4-H Clubs are being asked to set up a carnival style booth and provide 1-2 games. This event will be held at the fairgrounds. This is a great way to get older 4-H members involved and meet their county activity requirement. At each game, kids will earn tokens and Federation will offer prizes. Just a reminder - clubs need to notify Yolanda with the type of game(s) they are planning so that we have a variety of games. Since we aren't able to do International Night, this is a great way to bring clubs together at the fairgrounds.

Little Roots Cloverbud Gardening Program

Join us for a summer of growing and exploring in your own backyard! All Shelby County 4-H Cloverbud age members are invited to participate in the Little Roots Gardening Program! Little Roots is a gardening program for children 5-7 years old, it is a great activity for 4-H Cloverbud clubs or individuals. The program encourages and inspires youth to grow their own food and flowers and to increase interest in 4-H and gardening project areas. It was created by U of I Extension, Livingston-McLean-Woodford County horticulture, and 4-H educators in 2019.

A bright, kid-friendly gardening calendar guides children and an adult in growing seven different plants from seed through harvest. The calendar provides weekly activities from mid-April through September that encourage observing the world around them, researching horticulture basics, and caring for their plants. The youth will explore pollination & insects, weather, plant parts, the life cycle, and plant care. We are planning to set up a few fieldtrips to visit some different gardens this summer to enhance the learning process. Participants will receive seeds (radish, pumpkin, zinnia, sunflower, and basil), tomato & pepper transplants, a gardening calendar, and supplemental gardening resources. There is no fee to participate in the program.

4-H Dog Obedience Classes Starting April 5, 2022

Registration for Dog Obedience Classes will start at 6:30 p.m. on

April 5. 4-H Dog Obedience Classes will start on Tuesday, April 5 from 7 to 7:30 p.m. at the Shelby County Fairground Show Arena. Dogs should be at least 6 months old. You must bring proof of your dog's RABIES and DISTEMPER-PARVO vaccinations with you to registration. Bring a parent for the registration and your dog. There is a \$9 fee for the training collar and lead to be used only for dog obedience.

New members are welcome to enroll. Youth who are 8 years of age and have not reached their 19th birthday on or before September 1, 2021 are eligible to enroll. Members are required to pay the \$10 program fee but the fee is only paid by members once. Tailwagger only members need to pay the \$10 fee on April 5.

Shelby County 4-H Member Policy

If a 4-H member wishes to exhibit at the Shelby County 4-H Fair and be eligible to receive premiums, the following items must be completed by the 4-H'er:

- 4-H'er must attend <u>three</u> of their <u>own club</u> meetings. College students must attend two of their own 4-H Club meetings.
- 4-H'er must present a talk or demonstration at their <u>own club</u> meeting. The talk or demonstration must pertain <u>to a 4-H project</u>. It doesn't have to be a project the 4-H'er is in enrolled in.
- 4-H'er must participate in a county activity. Examples of a county activity include: Federation Club Challenges, 4-H Round-up, Winter Craft Day, 4-H Fire-Up, 4-H Week activities, Spring Cleanup at the fairgrounds, Spring Craft Day, 4-H project workshops, etc.

Project Manuals

• 4-H members may order up to 5 project books at no charge. Over 5 project books will be charged to members at cost. Members need to order books by contacting Yolanda.

Projects may be added until April 1.
