Small Engines Workshop

Monday, June 6

Full Throttle Small Engine Repair, LLC will be hosting a Small Engines Workshop on Monday, June 6 at 6:30 p.m. The workshop will be held at Full Throttle at 1108 W. North 2nd Street in Shelbyville.

4-H members will learn about tools needed for small engine repairs, discuss reading a model and serial number, filter maintenance and how to create a small engine display for the fair.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

All 4-H members enrolled in beef, dairy cattle, goats, swine and sheep are required to take the YQCA training. This training is required to be taken each year. In-person training is \$3 and the On-line training is \$12.

Shelby County 4-H is offering 3 in-person training sessions. The training is set up to be completed in approximately one hour. All training sessions will be held at the 4-H Center in Shelbyville. Don't wait to get signed up, class size is limited.

Online ethics certification required for everyone taking 4-H animal projects

Friday, June 3

First year animal exhibitors enrolled in dogs, horses, rabbits and poultry- take note!

All 4-H members enrolled in an animal project area are required to complete the online **Quality Assurance and Ethics course** one time in order to stay enrolled in the animal project area. The certification must be done if you are enrolled in one of the following projects: dogs, horses, poultry, and rabbits. Members who don't complete the certification before the show will be removed from the project and not be allowed to show. Anyone who has already taken the certification does not need to retake the test. The local office has a list of those already certified. Go to go.illinois.edu/4Hqaec. This rule applies to 4-H members who exhibit live animals AND poster exhibits. June 3 is the deadline!

Cloverbud exhibitors

Cloverbud members must complete fair entries for their projects. Families will follow the Fair Entry Instructions. Cloverbuds may exhibit 2 projects. Members enrolled in the Little Roots Gardening Program, may bring two projects from projects listed on page 68 of the fair book.

Cloverbud exhibitors will display their projects in the 4-H Center during the fair. Projects should be in place between 5-8 p.m. on Sunday, July 17. Little Roots gardening projects can be dropped off at the Produce Building on Sunday July 14 between 5-8 p.m. All projects can be picked up on Wednesday, July 20 from 9-10 p.m. or Thursday between 8-8:30 a.m.

Cloverbuds will have an opportunity to Chit Chat with an older 4-H member about their projects on July 20 at 1 p.m. at the Cook Shack. This event isn't required but is a great experience learning to talk with others. Special awards will be given to those who participate.

This is an excellent opportunity for Cloverbuds to be introduced to conference judging so they will know what to expect when they are a first year member.

Leasing animals

Leasing animals as 4-H projects is allowed. However, the following needs to be kept in mind: the animal should be cared for by the 4-H member, and prepped and ready for exhibit by the 4-H member.

If the 4-H member isn't able to care for the animal him– or herself, then other projects should be considered.

4-H Camp Scholarships

4-H & Jr. Fair Entries

Due Friday, June 3

The Shelby County 4-H & Junior Fair Book are divided into two sections. The Junior Fair is on yellow paper and will correspond to the yellow junior fair entry forms. The 4-H Fair is on green paper. There are two fairs going on. The livestock shows are judged together but placed separately. General projects are judged separately. 4-H entries are conference judged, while junior fair entries are not. 4-H Ratings are A & B's, state fair ribbons and champion trophies are awarded. The Junior Fair placings are 1-5th places and champion ribbons awarded.

4-H members will complete their 4-H entries in Fair Entry. The link is go.illinois.edu/22shelby4hfair. 4-H'ers can exhibit any Jr. Fair project - you do not have to be enrolled in the 4-H project.

Junior fair entries - Complete and turn in your exhibitor card with your entries. Junior fair entry forms are needed for each project area. Members will need to confirm their 4-H entries and Jr. Fair entries match and have corresponding projects in each fair. The following projects are 4-H only: bicycle, cats, child development, civic engagement, collectibles, college & career readiness, communications/journalism, consumer education, drones, 4-H exploratory, family heritage, health, intercultural, leadership, plants & soils, small pets/guinea pets, technologies, theatre arts, video/filmmaking, and weather.

General Projects Silent Auction

Wednesday, July 20

Shelby County 4-H is excited to offer a Silent Auction for some of our general projects this year. The Silent Auction will be run from 5-8 p.m. on Wednesday, July 20.

General Project exhibits in the areas of interior design, photography, woodworking, welding, and select visual arts projects will be selected by judges to participate in the silent auction. We plan to have 5-10 projects in the auction. 4-H'ers will complete the silent auction form stating they will or will not sell their project so alternates can be contacted. Those wishing to participate will be able to set a minimum selling price. Bidding will be done in increments of \$5. The bidding will end at 8 p.m. and the final names listed will be the winners of the auction. Checks will be made out to the 4-H member.

If the project was selected as a state fair project, members will need to state this on their entry and will receive payment once the they have delivered the item to the buyer.

We are going to pilot the silent auction this year and hope to make it bigger in 2023.

Master Showmanship Contest

Tuesday, July 19

The Master Showmanship Contest will be held on Tuesday, July 19 at 7 p.m. or following the dog show. A grand prize will be awarded to the overall winner.

Rules:

- 1. Exhibitor must exhibit at least one of the following species: beef, sheep, or swine at the Shelby County 4-H Fair.
- 2. Must be at least 14 years of age as of 9/1/21. (This is a state rule.)
- 3. It's your responsibility to find your own animals to compete in the county contest if you are not enrolled in that species. For example: You are a beef exhibitor but don't have sheep or swine, you must use your own beef and find a sheep and swine to borrow for the contest.

4. A special judge will be used for the Master Showmanship contest. **To qualify:**

- 1. The 2022 Senior and Premiere Showmanship winners in sheep and swine are automatically qualified to participate in the county contest. The 2021 Senior and Premiere Beef Showmanship winners will be allowed to participate and need to pre-register by July 1. Exhibitors are not required to participate in the county Master Showmanship contest.
- 2. Exhibitors will need to pre-register with the Extension office by July 1. There will be a waiting list with the understanding that some of those who pre-register could automatically qualify by winning the Senior and/or Premiere contests in their species. There will be a maximum of 12 exhibitors.

4-H Club Auction Donation

The Shelby County 4-H & Junior Fair Board is asking clubs to donate a basket of goodies, pies, themed baskets, etc. to auction during the Youth Livestock Auction on July 21.

The hope is that several clubs will participate and help raise money, which will be used for fairground improvements. If your club is interested in participating, please let Yolanda know the type of basket by July 8.

Changes to 4-H Cooking and Photography Judging times

This year 4-H Cooking, Food Preservation, Food Science, Sports Nutrition, and 4-H Photography projects will be judged on Saturday, July 16. Check-in time will be from 8-9 a.m. and judging will start at 9 a.m. for Cooking 101-401 and all other food project areas will start at 10 a.m.

Photography judging will start at 9 a.m.

All projects will stay on display during fair week and will be released on Wednesday, July 20 at 9 p.m.

Photography projects need to be accompanied by details of the camera setting. Read page 98 in the fair book for details.

This four-month long program is an all-summer, self-paced 4-H event involving all 4-H families in our fivecounty unit: Coles, Cumberland, Douglas, Moultrie, and Shelby counties. You need to have a leader or parent from your club work the shift that your club is scheduled to work and the number of 4-H'ers listed. <u>If a person or club cannot come at the time designated, please switch with</u> <u>someone, or let YOLANDA know so that a replacement may be found</u>. PLEASE COME ABOUT 10 MINUTES EARLY SO THAT YOUR CLUB IS READY TO WORK. Remember the money earned from this barbecue helps finance Shelby County 4-H and Extension.

Shelby County 4-H Member Policy

If a 4-H member wishes to exhibit at the Shelby County 4-H Fair and be eligible to receive premiums, the following items must be completed by the 4-H'er:

- 4-H'er must attend <u>three</u> of their <u>own club</u> meetings. College students must attend two of their own 4-H Club meetings.
- 4-H'er must present a talk or demonstration at their <u>own club</u> meeting. The talk or demonstration must pertain <u>to a 4-H project</u>. It doesn't have to be a project the 4-H'er is in enrolled in.
- 4-H'er must participate in a county activity. Examples of a county activity include: Federation Club Challenges, 4-H Round-up, Winter Craft Day, 4-H Fire-Up, 4-H Week activities, Spring Cleanup at the fairgrounds, Spring Craft Day, 4-H project workshops, etc.
