Bank Steer Program

Deadline Friday, Nov. 19

Are you interested in raising, showing and selling a steer as a 4-H project? The Shelby County State Bank is offering interest-free loans to Shelby County 4-H members to assist them in purchasing a steer to exhibit at the fair.

In order to be eligible to participate in this program, the 4-H member must have been enrolled in 4-H at least one previous year. Members must complete enrollment via 4H Online or a completed enrollment form submitted to the Extension office. *The Assumption of Risk from Liability* form and the \$10 program fee must also be submitted to the Extension office by November 19.

Note - new families will have an on-farm visit from the Bank Steer Committee prior to steer weigh-in, all participants will have an on-farm visit in the Spring by the Bank Steer Committee. Shelby County State Bank reserves the right to deny any individual participation in the Bank Steer Program.

The deadline to sign up for a bank steer is November 19. Pick-up for steers will be in February at steer weigh-in.

4-H Shotgun SPIN Club

Federation Club Challenge

October - December, 2021

At the September meeting, Federation discussed offering Club Challenges on a quarterly basis this 4-H year. There will be 4 groups of challenges offered with a total of 8 activities. For each club that completes 5 out of 8 activities, Federation will award the club \$50 in September 2022.

The Shelby County 4-H Club Fall Challenge is as follows:

- 1. Complete 2 community service activities of the clubs choice.
- 2. Submit a picture of each activity to Yolanda by 12/31/21.
- 3. Each club that completes the Fall Challenge will have their name entered into a drawing for refreshments at their January meeting.

Club challenges count as a county activity but they must be service related. Donations do not count as a county activity.

Fall is a great time to recruit new members. Many communities have Trunk or Treats that clubs can set up displays and pass out promotional material and candy. The Scarecrow Daze committee is looking for organizations to set up booths or a petting zoo on October 9. Crop Exhibitors

The Shelby County Junior Fair Crops division offers exhibitors the following options:

- 6 ears of field corn from the 2021 crop year - Each being of equal size, free from insect or disease damage.
- A gallon of soybeans which should be displayed in a clear jar and free of trash, cracked beans or splits.

As harvest is beginning, 4-H'ers can get a jumpstart on their 2022 Junior Fair entries.

New projects for 2022

There are two new projects this 4-H year.

Crop Cover - Investigate new planting processes, explore genetic modification, and develop new products to learn how cover crops can benefit agriculture and the environment.

Visual Arts Quilting - Those enrolling in this project should already have some sewing experience. You'll learn basic quilting and piecing techniques. You will learn about types of quilting equipment. Members will explore options for finishing quilts, tie quilts, bindings and machine quilting.

Shelby County 4-H Member Policy

If a 4-H member wishes to exhibit at the Shelby County 4-H Fair and be eligible to receive premiums, the following items must be completed by the 4-H'er:

- 4-H'er must attend <u>three</u> of their <u>own club</u> meetings. College students must attend two of their own 4-H Club meetings.
- 4-H'er must present a talk or demonstration at their <u>own club</u> meeting. The talk or demonstration must pertain <u>to a 4-H project</u>. It doesn't have to be a project the 4-H'er is in enrolled in.
- 4-H'er must participate in a county activity. Examples of a county activity include: Federation Club Challenges, 4-H Round-up, Winter Craft Day, 4-H Fire-Up, 4-H Week activities, Spring Cleanup at the fairgrounds, Spring Craft Day, 4-H project workshops, etc.

Project Manuals

- 4-H members may order up to 5 project books at no charge. Over 5 project books will be charged to members at cost. Members need to order books by contacting Yolanda.
 - 4-H members need to be enrolled and paid their \$10 program fee by December 15 to qualify for the early enrollment incentive!

 Projects may be added until April 1.
