Virtual 4-H Show Announcement & Registration Process

On June 1st, all 4-H members and families received communication from Dr. Lisa Diaz, Illinois State 4-H Program Leader, announcing that all in-person events sponsored by Illinois Extension through July 5 will be canceled or moved to an online format. This includes all 4-H club meetings, events, and summer exhibit opportunities.

The Christian County 4-H program and their summer shows are affected by this announcement and are adapting their judging experiences accordingly.

2020 Virtual 4-H Show Information

For this year's 4-H shows, we will be using the online Fair Entry system – which has been used to register for the 4-H shows for the past few years. Members will still register for the proper classes as usual. For the virtual show, each entry will also include pictures, videos or documents of your project for the judge to review. These MUST be uploaded during the registration/entry process. Instructions are included to guide you through entering your projects and uploading the proper documents for each. Also included is a list of picture requirements for uploading during registration.

An overview of the proposed timeline for entry and judging is included below:

- July 3rd—Fair Entry opens for all members to enter projects and supporting documents (pictures, videos, project reports)
- July 8th—GENERAL PROJECTS DEADLINE—Fair Entry will close (end of day) for all general project entries
- July 13—17—Judging of GENERAL PROJECTS in the Fair Entry system (closed judging)
- July 23rd—LIVESTOCK DEADLINE—Fair Entry will close (end of day) for all livestock entries
- By July 24th—Results of General Project judging
- July 24th—28th—Judging of LIVESTOCK PROJECTS in the Fair Entry system (closed judging)
- By July 31st—All results available and released publicly (state fair delegates must announce their project selection by this date)

Livestock-Specific Show Information

All June 2020 4-H livestock and other live animal exhibits are also being moved to a virtual format. Livestock entries will still register for the appropriate classes and shows as outlined in the show book through the Fair Entry system. In order to capture the animal and its movements, we hope that members can 'show' their animals at home, capture it on video, and submit these videos along with their online entries.

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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS WHEN PREPARING FOR THE VIRTUAL 4-H SHOWS

How do I know what I need to be preparing or entering for my virtual exhibit this year?

For the virtual show, members are submitting two things for each project area: 1) photos, videos, or a slide show presentation that showcases what they have learned or made, and 2) a completed 4-H Project Report.

For each project area and class, different photos or vidoes might be required. Some projects will just require a few photos of your exhibit. Others might require more or require specific photos (i.e. photos of specific pieces of your aerospace exhibit). <u>All project requirements have been updated in the virtual show book</u>. Make sure you review these requirements and refer to what is needed

What is the 4-H Project Report? Why is it important?

The project report will accompany every project and class entry this year. It is a one-page document with 5-6 questions that members will complete—what was a challenge you faced while completeing this project, what is something you want the judge to know or be aware of while they are judging, etc. This report will hopefully be a good stand-in for the conference judging and one-on-one discussion that would usually happen between the judge and member at an in-person show.

Make sure you take time to think about your responses and complete these reports for each project. These reports will often be how the judge learns a little more about your project than just what they see in a photo. *For livestock animals, you might have one report for an animal/specie but you still need to submit it for each class that you enter.

I never received my project books to help prepare me for my exhibit. What do I do?

We submitted a publication order around the time campus offices and our local offices closed. Therefore, we know many of you never received the project books you ordered or had an opportunity to pick them up from our offices.

Know that we will NOT be enforcing any project book requirements for the virtual shows. You will not have to complete or show proof that you complete an activity from your project book, if that is usually a requirement.

If you still want or need access to a project book, please contact the Extension Office. Many are available for purchase at shop4h.org and some can be downloaded digitally.

I'm concerned I don't have the proper internet access to support entering my projects and/or uploading my photos or videos. What should I do?

If you can usually stream online video services without interruptions, you should not have any problems with accessing Fair Entry or uploading your photos/vidoes. However, if you need access to wifi, you are free to use the public wifi located at the Extnesion Office. While our offices are still closed, you still access it from the parking lot without major problems.

LIVESTOCK REMINDERS & UPDATES

- Make sure you take note of Fair Entry deadlines for livestock as they may differ from general projects.
- Almost all livestock entries will require a video over photos. However, if pictures are easier or necessary, make sure you capture all sides of the animal and follow the video instructions as closely as possible.
- YQCA requirements will be waived for our county shows this year.
- Check the virtual show book on information regarding the Master Showmanship Contest this year.
- Information regarding the Stockman Contest is still being planned. Information will be shared directly with families when a decision is made.
- As of 6/15/2020, we do not have additional information regarding state fair livestock shows and entry deadlines. It was announced that the Illinois State Fair is cancelled in August but there is the potential for live animal shows later in September. Current entry deadlines are as follows but are, of course, subject to change.

June 20th—Entry Deadline for State Horse Show *subject to change July 15th—Entry deadline for state livestock shows *subject to change

The 4-H Everyday Sportsman's Skills Challenge is currently underway and runs continuously until July 15, 2020. Interested 4-H Members are presented with three sportsman's skills at a time which they learn by viewing suggested videos. Once they've mastered the skills, they contact their 4-H leader or 4-H staff person to communicate what they've learned.
