

Expand your family's cultural understanding, learn about new foods and customs, and possibly learn a new language all while sharing your own. Your children will build lifelong friendships and will gain new perspectives on their own country, too! Families are needed for July 22 through August 17.

Be aware:

- Families hosting a youth must have a child the same gender and approximate age (12-18) as the incoming youth.
- Youth must have a separate bed; a separate room is not required.
- Host family selection is dependent on completion of an application and screening process, as well as student availability and personality compatibility.
- Applications are accepted until all placements are made



### **Shooting Sports volunteers needed**

Many young people don't have someone to show them how to safely handle a firearm or bow. Think back to the person who taught you to shoot. The Illinois 4-H program needs adults willing to serve as mentors and share their passion of shooting sports. Here's what you need to do:

- Contact your local Extension office and complete the required forms and background checks. The local office will complete your registration.
- Complete a 3-hour online training module at home.
- Attend a 9-hour hands-on field day which runs from 9 AM to 7 PM. Check your local office to see if assistance is available for the \$85 fee. Training dates for 2020 are:
  - Southern Illinois: Saturday, March 28 at Tombstone Gun Range, Marion. Register by March 18.
  - Western Illinois: Saturday, June 13 at Gardner Camp, Hull. Register by June 3.
  - Northern Illinois: Saturday, Sept. 12 at Torstenson Youth Education Center, Pecatonica. Register by September 2.

#### STATE 4-H HORSE HIPPOLOGY CONTEST

#### STATE 4-H HORSE BOWL CONTEST

#### STATE 4-H HORSE SPEAKING CONTEST

#### April 18 | David Kinley Hall, University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign | 10 AM

Any 4-H members may participate. No pre-qualifying is needed, but you must register at the Extension office by mid-March. Cost is \$3 per entry. You'll share ideas with others as you develop the ability to speak in public about the horse industry and the 4-H Horse project. Learn more @ go.illinois.edu/4Hhorsespeaking. There are 5 divisions:

- · Original individual formal speech
- **Original individual presentation**: either demonstration (step by step process) or illustrated talk on an idea or topic; both use visual aids.
- **Original team presentation**: either demonstration (step by step process) or illustrated talk on an idea or topic; both using visual aids.
- Extempore speaking: topic is selected at the event and participants have 25 minutes to prepare a 4- to 6-minute speech.
- NEW IN 2020: **Interpretive Reading** is the art of reading aloud from a printed page. The reading must be published works that are horse-related. They may be prose, poetry, short stories, play cuttings, narratives, book or review, or theatrical. You should NOT memorize; they are intended to be read from a page.

Join 4-H members and clubs across Illinois and the nation on **Saturday, April 25** as part of *True Leaders in Service*! 4-H clubs serve their communities all year long however the month of April has been selected as a time for ALL 4-H clubs to join together to roll up their sleeves in service to local communities. This could mean helping a person or family in need doing yard work or minor home repairs, cleaning up streets or

parks, planting trees or gardens, supporting your local food pantry or any other project that supports a local need.

The goal of the 4-H True Leaders in Service day is to encourage 4-H members in every county to make a positive difference. ## Let's go fishing

May 2 – 3 | 4-H Memorial Camp, Monticello Learn more @ go.illinois.edu/4Hfishcamp

With the lake fully stocked, 4-H Fish Camp is back at 4-H Memorial Camp near Monticello. Fishing begins at 10 a.m. Saturday, May 2 and lasts until 2 p.m. Sunday, May 3. Learn how to catch largemouth bass, crappie, bluegill, and channel catfish. Learn about fishing tips, lures, bait, equipment, knots, fish behavior, fish management,

and fish cleaning. Each group registered will be assigned their own log cabin for lodging with single bunks. Participants must bring their own bedding and toiletries.

A fee of \$50 per person covers the complete program, lodging, boat, bait, and three buffet meals, including Saturday lunch and supper and a Sunday brunch. You'll also have fresh fish fillets to take home! Pre-registration and payment is required. ## Foundation Hall of Fame ceremony set

The Illinois 4-H Foundation will honor one volunteer leader from each county at a ceremony during the Illinois State Fair. The celebration begins at 3 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 18 as part of Ag Day at the fair right before the Sale of Champions activities begin. Supporters and families of the recipients are welcome to attend.

#### Look for these changes at the Illinois State Fair

With the timing of the state fair and the anticipated start of school, the 4-H General Project Show at the state fair has been condensed to three days: Aug. 14, 15, and 16.

- Exhibits must be in place by 9:30 AM and remain on display until 4 PM. (new release time)
- The awards will include Champion Medals for the highest score in each project class and Reserve Medals
  for the second highest score in each class. Cash premiums from the state will be paid to the medal winners.
  Innovation Awards will be given to exhibits judges find inspiring, innovative, or creative and are not based
  on scores. Medal winners cannot receive the innovation award in 2020.
- **New projects** at the state fair include: Child Development, Leather, Sports Nutrition, Family Heritage, and Shooting Sports
- The **State 4-H Public Speaking Contest** will be held at the same time as the state fair. Youth can compete in a speech and also bring a project to the General Project Show. Youth must be selected in their county contest to advance and will speak the same day as their county exhibit day.
- Ewe lambs are now eligible for the premier show.
- Steers advancing to state fair must be weighed by Feb. 29.
- The **junior poultry show** begins Monday, Aug. 17.
- The State 4-H Poultry Judging Contest will be held at the state fair on Monday, Aug. 17.
- The **junior rabbit show** begins Saturday, Aug. 22.
