Hello 4-H families,

Enrollment is now open for the 2020-2021 4-H program year. We appreciate your patience as we have rolled out an updated version of our online enrollment system, 4-H Online 2.0.

Please take note of the following updates as well:

- You may have to change your password. With the new update, all passwords must contain a certain number or characters and special characters. If you cannot log in with your previous password, you will need to select 'Reset My Password' on the first screen. Reset information will be sent to your email.
- Your program fee is being waived locally for the 2020-2021 program year. When enrolling, you will still click through the payment screens for the usual \$20 fee. Please select the 'pay by check' option, but please know you will not be required to pay this year.
- You will order project books separately. In years past, you requested the project books while enrolling in the project online. This year, you will receive a separate link in your enrollment confirmation email that will direct you to selecting your project books. This link is also listed below. The state office is collecting those responses and returning them to us, locally, so that we can get manuals ordered and to you. We are still determining details for pick-up, delivery. Members are responsible for the payment of publications when they pick them up. LINK TO ORDER PROJECT BOOKS: go.illinois.edu/pubsrequest
- Some of the vocabulary will look different. On some screens, the word 'unit' is used to refer to a 4-H club and the word 'area' is sometimes used in conjunction with 'county'.

There may still be small updates to the system so continue to practice patience as you begin the enrollment process. If you have any questions or run into issues, please let me know. We are happy to assist you and your family in getting signed up for another great 4-H year!

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
