Montgomery County 4-H Foundation Scholarship

Eligibility

- 1. Plan to attend a 2-year to 4-year college/vocational/technical school.
- 2. 2021/2022 school year High school graduate
- 3. You must have participated in 4-H and be a current 4-H member.
- 4. Applications must be completed online by March 14, 2022.
- 5. You can only receive the scholarship one time.
- 6. Applications must include 4-H Experience Award Applications for two previous years.

Requirements

- 1. Complete the online application including document uploads by **March 14, 2022**. go.illinois.edu/montgomeryfoundationscholarship
 - a. Include two reference letters
 - b. Include your high school transcripts
 - c. Include 2020 & 2021 4-H Experience Award Applications
- 2. Complete an interview with members of the Montgomery County 4-H Foundation Board.

(The interview will be held on March 21, 2022, beginning at 6:00 p.m.)

FAQs

How do I get my scholarship check?

Send a copy (or screenshot) of your class schedule or tuition bill to ehugh2@illinois.edu. Checks will be written after October 1st. You will not receive your check until proof of enrollment is submitted.

Do you send the check to my school?

No, the checks are written out to you and mailed to the mailing address in our 4-H online system.

What if I must delay my enrollment into school? Do I lose my scholarship?

No, you will not lose your scholarship. If you need to put off using the scholarship money for a year, that is okay. Contact Montgomery County 4-H Program Coordinator and file a request to postpone scholarship funds.

What can I use my scholarship funds for?

Any costs associated with your schooling: books, tuition, housing, travel, supplies, computer, etc.

How much are the scholarships provided by the Montgomery County 4-H Foundation?

The Montgomery County 4-H Foundation awardsscholarship funds based on your involvement in 4-H. They set aside up to \$5,000 each year for scholarship funds. *All scholarship amounts are at the discretion of the Montgomery County 4-H Foundation. In recognition of the foundational principles of 4-H, and the desire to ensure that the recipients of the 4-H scholarships adhere to these principles, the 4-H Foundation reserves the right to remove a candidate's name from the scholarship process or withdraw a scholarship from a recipient if there is credible evidence that the applicant/recipient has violated any state or local laws which adversely affect the 4-H principles.
