YQCA is currently required for those showing: Beef, Goats, Sheep, or Swine

The YQCA training can be done either online or in person. The cost for the face to face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

QAEC requirement (new livestock members)

All 4-H members enrolled in an animal project area are required to complete the online **Quality Assurance** and **Ethics course** one time in order to stay enrolled in an animal project area.

The certification must be done if you are enrolled in one of the following projects: beef, dairy, cats, dogs, goats, horses, poultry, rabbits, sheep, and swine. Members who don't complete the certification before the show will be removed from the project and not be allowed to show. *Anyone who has already taken the certification does not need to retake the test*.



QUALITY ASSURANCE & ETHICS (QA&E):

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats. Members must take the training whether they own a live animal or not. It is advised that they complete this one time as soon as they are enrolled in the project area. Counties will monitor completion of this. Failure to complete QA&E will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs. The website is open year round @ http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/

NOTE: Youth must be logged on to a computer for this program, either a desktop or laptop; not an iPad or iPhone. The program cannot capture the information for county staff to see when it is completed using iPads or iPhones.

The Effingham County 4-H Recognition Award is sponsored by the Effingham County 4-H Foundation.

4-H Clubs can resume face-to-face meetings with the following guidelines: A *Safety Management Plan* is required for all in-person events hosted by the University of Illinois (including 4-H meetings and events) or in a facility owned or managed by the university. The *Safety Management Plan* should include these essential details.

Currently, we are at gathering size limit:

Face-to-face events, outdoors: Gathering size limited to lesser of 50 people or 50% of space capacity. Social distancing required; face coverings required.

Face-to-face events, indoors: Gathering size limited to lesser of 50 people or 50% of space capacity. Social distancing and face coverings required.

The numbers above would include parents that attend the meetings. For anyone that does not feel comfortable attending in person, please contact your 4-H leader to see if other accommodations can be made. We do not want anyone to feel they must attend in person. Your safety, your family and our 4-H leaders' safety is our number one priority! 4-H clubs that have a private 4-H club page can do a Facebook live, Zoom, Google meet or if anyone knows of other ways members can still participate in the club meeting but virtually. This is a great opportunity for Jr. Leaders to take charge and organize. If you have any questions or need any assistance, please contact Patti Logan.

Effingham County Fair

With the 4-H Fair season quickly approaching there will be a few policies and procedures put into effect for our exhibitors. First, as a reminder, the only two species that are allowed to be leased are horses and canine. All other livestock are exempt from the lease provision.

Second, exhibitors wishing to show goats and sheep will be required to submit photos of their project. Required photos will include full view of left side, full view of right side, and any and all other identifiable distinguishing marks or scars.

PHOTOS OF MARKET LIVESTOCK – Species that are required to submit photos of their animals are: sheep, swine, and goat.

- a. Beef will receive tattoos in each ear. All beef steers are required to come to weigh in.
- b. Swine exhibitors will need to produce ear notches and tag numbers by June 1.
- c. Sheep & Goats take a picture of scrapie tags. All photos must be turned into the Effingham Extension office by June 1.

Sheep will May 1 from 9 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.

Boer/Dairy Goats - June 5 from 9 to 10:30 a.m., ALL wethers must be weighed in at Effingham County Fairgrounds.

4-H Livestock Records

ALL 4-H Members taking a livestock project are **REQUIRED** to complete a 4-H Livestock record for the following species: beef, dairy, swine, sheep, poultry, rabbit, goat, and horse.

These records are inspected, along with other health documents at county 4-H fair check-in.

Quality Assurance & Ethics (QA&E):

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats. Members must take the training whether they own a live animal or not. It is advised that they complete this one time as soon as they are enrolled in the project area. Failure to complete QA&E will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs. The website is open year-round @ http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

The YQCA is a livestock quality assurance program that is replacing PQA which no longer exists. This training replaces the Quality Assurance & Ethics (QAEC) program for youth in the following species: dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats. All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program yearly. Youth must either attend a face to face class or certify on-line via the website http://yqca.org The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18, and young adults 19-21. This certification is annual with test out options of 1-3 years. Youth exhibiting swine at the Illinois State Fair and 4-H fairs are no longer required to be PQA plus certified. The cost for the face to face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

Shooting Sports, Environmental Education Illinois 4-H is being asked for help with an important research project!

I-Pollinate is a citizen science initiative and will be offering \$100 to each of 54 small "study" gardens established by Illinois 4-H members this spring if they agree to report back on-line their observations of which annual, ornamental flowers pollinators prefer on their gardens. The task at hand though is to spread these gardens out statewide – so only one garden per county will be allowed until all 54 are registered. Leaders can apply for funding by completing a training and registering their garden. These are small garden plots with specific plants – literally only $4' \times 6'$ in size.



A detailed training will open April 26th, and data collection won't start until National Pollinator Week June 21st but I wanted to give you a teaser now! Be thinking of who to invite from your local areas! Along with the \$100 reimbursement for supplies and materials, 4-H members completing the reporting observations will receive an I-Pollinator Certificate; permanent sign for their garden; and an honorary pin! Good stuff for a future entomology project display!
