Club Expectations
As you plan your activities for the year, keep in mind the following expectations from Illinois 4-H:
1. The first priority is to create a safe, inclusive space for learning, sharing, and collaboration that is welcoming to people from diverse backgrounds, cultures, and perspectives.
 At least 1 fully screened volunteer must always be present with youth during 4-H activities. Youth should never be left with a non-screened adult.
3. Clubs should have at least 5 members or be actively working to recruit new members.
4. Clubs must meet at least 6 times in a year.
5. Youth should be involved in planning and decision making, including serving as elected officers. The Secretary should record attendance and meeting minutes to turn in at the end of the 4-H year. Cloverbud clubs do not have elected officers.
6. Clubs must follow Illinois Extension fiscal policies. Clubs that hold more than \$20 should have a checking account. The Treasurer must track all income/expenses and complete a Financial Statement at the end of the year. Clubs with bank accounts can have up to 2 fundraisers per calendar year. Leaders should consult with staff on any fiscal management questions.
7. If you want to use the 4-H logo on t-shirts or anything else, contact staff for logo information.
8. If you want to do an overnight field trip or an activity that might involve extra risk, talk to 4-H staff first.

should not feel committed to the ideas you write here; we all know that plans often change throughout the year. The purpose of writing down a few ideas is to help you and your members bring focus to all the possibilities of what you can do as a club.
Promotion – at least 1 thing your club will do to recruit new members <i>EXAMPLES: share flyers with friends, speak about 4-H at our school, participate in a town festival</i>

Fun! — at least 1 fun activity that will help members get to know each other better EXAMPLES: annual fall cookout, family game night, Christmas party
Learning – at least 1 activity, guest speaker, or field trip that will help members learn something new <i>EXAMPLES: fishing clinic with IDNR, practicing parliamentary procedure, Spark Sheet activities</i>
Service – at least 1 activity your club can do to serve your community EXAMPLES: make cards for veterans, paint park benches, cemetery clean-up
