More 4-H Exhibit Opportunities

Innovation classes - many projects will offer an innovation class. In this class you must demonstrate skills and knowledge you have gained through the project you have studied. Your exhibit should not fit in the other exhibit option for that particular project. See if your project offers an innovation class by looking in the fair book under your project class.

Ready4Life Challenge (Career & Entrepreneurship Ex-

ploration) - Must be enrolled in the specific Ready4Life project to exhibit and:

- Must be 11 years by September 1, 2018 or older.
- A physical representation of the career or business product such as a model, prototype or display/portfolio that includes images of accomplished work.
- Verbal or written explanations that demonstrate knowledge of the related career or business fields, potential careers, and the appropriate requirements for achievement in those fields.
- The judging criteria for this class values thoroughness of career and/or business exploration and pursuit above the workmanship of the physical specimen on display.

Maker Class - Exhibits in this category are designed to be multi-disciplinary in nature, innovative, and must not fit into any other exhibit category. To qualify for this category see pages 61-62 of the Fair & Policy book.

An exhibitor may bring only a class project, Ready4Life project, or maker project, but not more than one. Please call the office if you have questions.

Fair Entry - Open

Coles County's Fair Entry will close **June 17**. All fair exhibits are to be entered through the FairEntry.com system. Those who wish to participate in any of the 4-H county shows must be registered, **same day registrations not be accepted**. Only projects you signed up for during open enrollment may be exhibited. Aerospace Show and Rocket Launch

The annual 4-H Aerospace Judging and Rocket launch will be held at the Coles County Fairgrounds on **Thursday, June 27 from 5:30 to 7 p.m.** Judging will begin at 5:30 p.m. with a launch to follow. This event includes judging of model rockets and planes, poster displays will be judged during general projects. **Exhibitors, please bring a printed copy of your rocket instructions, you will be judged based on how well you followed the instructions down to the finest details including paint color and decal placement.** Exhibitors should also be building a model worthy of their age preferably with balsa fins which require good finishing skills to be smooth and aerodynamic. **Please no RTF(ready to fly)** models. Plastic fin models should be avoided altogether. Please bring a **low power** engine if you are planning to launch to easily recover your rocket.

Cloverbud Exhibit Opportunity

Cloverbud exhibitors may display their project in the 4-H Center during the General Projects Show. Cloverbuds will have an opportunity to have **one** of their projects "judged" on Saturday, July 20 between 9-11 a.m. "Judging" isn't required but is a great experience in learning how to talk to others about their project. This is an excellent opportunity for Cloverbuds to be introduced to conference judging so they will know what to expect when they are first-year members. Fair Prep/clean-up

Fairground clean-up and set-up for the Coles County 4-H Fair will be held on **Thursday, July 25 at 5:30**. All 4-H members are asked to help. Please bring necessary working tools (rakes, hammers, cleaning supplies, etc.). Again, we appreciate all who are willing to help make our fairgrounds ready for the fair. **This is** everyone's fair and we need everyone there to help!

Attention Livestock Exhibitors

If your 4-H livestock animal is ill, do not bring it to the fair! Animals may be subject to an evaluation if showing symptoms or behaviors deemed abnormal. These animals may be excused from the show and removed from the fairgrounds. Please, do not jeopardize the health of the other animals in the barns!

GOATS - Weigh-in AND vet check will be on Sunday, July 28 following the swine and sheep weigh-ins/vet check. Please have health papers available for inspection Sunday morning.

CATTLE - Vet check will be on Monday, July 29, coinciding with the goat vet check. Please have your health papers ready for inspection.

SWINE & SHEEP - Health and registration papers must be checked by the superintendent &/or vet after the Sunday weighin (swine weigh-in 8:00 a.m., followed by sheep). Please do not leave the premises until after your papers have been checked and approved! Purebred animals will not be allowed to show without registration papers.

HORSE - In an effort to speed up the Horse Show, our superintendent has asked exhibitors to please bring in a copy of your mandatory Coggins Test to the Extension office prior to show day. If, for some reason, you are unable to do so, it will be required the morning of the show.

State 4-H News



4-H Storytellers Be authentic | Share truth | Build connections

In July, 4-H members will be invited to become a 4-H Storyteller. In the fall, 20 youth selected from the applicants will be trained by some of Illinois's finest storytellers. The stories may take the form of written word: blogs, poetry, letters. They may take the form of art: photography, art, comics. They may take the form of sound: video, song, podcast. 4-H Storytellers will tell their personal stories, and in doing so, we will see 4-H in action in their lives. Look for more in the July newsletter. This opportunity is open to youth who will be in grades 8 to 11 this fall.

Applicants will be asked to submit two original examples of any of the following things: blogs, poetry, letters, photography, art, comics, video, song, podcast, or other form not listed. The two examples may be of the same form or different forms. Applicants must also answer the following question using whatever medium they want: **What story do you have to tell and why is that topic important to be shared?** The program is sponsored in full by the Illinois 4-H Foundation.

New awards, new scoresheets at Illinois State Fair

4-H members selected at their county to exhibit at the state fair will see some changes in the way exhibits are judged and prizes awarded. Judges at the state fair will use a 10-point scale and give members a score for each element of their exhibit:

Their knowledge about the project Their conference presentation of the project The presentation of the exhibit The new scoresheets are all posted online @ go.illinois.edu/4Hstatefair. For each EXHIBIT CLASS, a champion and reserve champion will be awarded based on points received.

In addition, **INSPIRE AWARDS** will be given at the judges' discretion for work they wish to highlight or acknowledge. Awards will vary in quantity, description, and type between project areas. These awards will not be based solely on scores. Check back soon for more on the new judging and award systems.

End of year award time is approaching

Whether you are a first-year 4-H member or a longtime member, it's time to focus on pulling together information for your 4-H award applications. Even younger members can submit the 4-H Experience Application and be eligible for 4-H recognition. Older members can submit both the 4-H Experience Application and the Illinois 4-H Award Application to be eligible for state recognition, scholarships, and/or trips.

The **Illinois 4-H Experience Award Application** focuses on all of those events and activities that you have experienced during the 4-H year in four areas: *Participation, Community Service, Leadership,* and *Project Learning.* Depending upon the type and number of experiences you can report on, members can receive recognition on the Bronze, Silver, Gold, Diamond or Emerald Clover Award level. Your family calendar, 4-H notes or county summary, checkmarks, and a few written details are all that's needed for even the youngest members to submit this application. Each 4-H member has a story to tell and are eligible for our 4-H awards program – tell YOUR stories and see where they take you!
