# Online ethics certification required for everyone taking 4-H animal projects—even those who exhibit posters

All 4-H members enrolled in an animal project area are required to complete the online **Quality Assurance and Ethics course** one time in order to stay enrolled in an animal project area. *This rule applies to 4-H members who exhibit live animals AND poster exhibits.* 

The certification must be done if you are enrolled in one of the following projects: beef, dairy, cats, dogs, goats, horses, poultry, rabbits, sheep, small pets, and swine. This is a one-time requirement and must be completed prior to showing at the fair. Anyone who has already taken the certification does not need to retake the test. The local office has a list of those already certified. Visit: <u>http://</u> web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/ to complete your certification.

The deadline to complete the training is June 1.

# **4-H Membership Policies for Coles**

## County

Youth who are at least 8 years of age and have not reached their 19th birthday on or before September 1, 2018, may enroll in 4-H. Youth who are 5 through 7 years of age on or before September 1, 2018, may enroll in 4-H Cloverbud groups.

#### **4-H Exhibit Requirements:**

- 4-H member MUST attend more than half of their club meetings. (see page 22 of 2019 Fair & Policy Book for further information).
- 4-H member MUST present and talk or demonstration at their own club meeting or school <u>about a 4-H</u> <u>project;</u> and
- ➡ 4-H member MUST participate in a county activity.

A youth who enrolls in a 4-H club but fails to do <u>ALL</u> of the above will <u>NOT</u> be eligible to take part in county 4-H exhibitions, receive 4-H premiums or other awards and recognition. Leaders will track this information.

#### **Approved County Activities**

Each 4-H member is required to participate in an approved county activity in order to exhibit at the 4-H Fair. The following is a list of approved county activities:

Fall/Winter - 18th Street Fall Festival, Winter
Craft Day, Officer Training.
January - Skating Party
February - Jr. Leadership Conference
April - 4-H BBQ, including chop & green bean prep
May - 4-H Camp, Healthy Food Distribution Day
June - Any workshop, Illini Summer Academies
Only one activity is required, but the hope is 4-H members will attend many of the activities and workshops so they can make their 4-H experience the best it can be.

# Changes You Should Know for 2019 Fair Exhibits - Repeat info

The state 4-H office has made some changes to our exhibit guidelines for the 2019 fair. These changes will be reflected in the 2019 Fair & Policy Book. Here is a sneak peak:

Citizenship has been changed to Civic Engagement - only a name change.

Communications, Creative Writing, & Journalism are now state fair eligible.

**Computer Science** major changes: beginning visual programming level in NOT eligible for state fair. An open source class was added and class names were changed to Visual-based & Text-based programming.

**Foods** exhibits major changes in 101- 401. Each class will now need to complete an experiment/activity in the project manual and bring a document with a printed picture of your experiment/activity with your project. Sources for **Food Preservation** have changed, added are Ball/Kerr <u>after 1985</u>, & Mrs. Wages. **Food Innovation** class added.

**Photography** ALL photos must include details of the camera settings, minimum image size 5X7, maximum 8X10. Photography 1 exhibit one framed photo demonstrating a technique you learned from the project manual. Be prepared to show the page in the manual of the technique. Photography 2, 3 - one 8X10.

**Robotics** major changes: Robotics 1 Beginning and Junk Drawer Robotics 1 are NO LONGER eligible for state fair.

3-D Print & Design NO LONGER eligible for state fair. UAV Drones NO LONGER eligible for state fair.360 Video and Technology classes have been eliminated.

**Visual Arts changes:** Exhibitors MUST be enrolled in a specific project directly tied to their exhibit class. Chalk/Carbon/Pigment has two unique classes depending on the material on which the art was created. Division A - canvas, paper, or glass. Division B wood, metal or textiles. Clarification between Fiber Arts and Heritage arts was added, as well as for wood.

#### Weather - new class

Maker class - new to all project areas (see specifics in the 2019 Fair & Policy book)

# Be sure to read the 2019 Fair & Policy book for all of the changes. Always read the rules for your project area so you know what is expected at the fair.

**Sheep**: if going to state fair there is a self-nomination procedure, call the office for details.

**Goats**: if going to state fair there is a self-nomination procedure, call the office for details. **Horned goats** will now be staying at the county fair in the dairy cattle barn. **Fair board will not be providing pens**. Extension and Foundation will provide materials needed to build the proper pens/gates. We hope those families with horned goats will help with the construction. More details to come.

Everyone has a 4-H story. Now, you can win \$50 for telling yours! Winners statewide will b selected and their 4-H story used in 2020. Here is everything you need to know.

- Your video should be no longer than 90 seconds.
- Your video should relate to one of these topics:
  - \*Through 4-H, I've been able to ...
  - \*In my 4-H XXXXX project, I've learned .....
  - \*4-H has taught me to care about my community. I've ...
  - \*4-H has helped me feel welcomed by ......
  - \*I've strengthened my leadership skills through 4-H by ...
  - \*In the future I want to XXXXX and here's how 4-H has helped ...
- Every video should end with "Because of 4-H, I ..... Thanks for helping me grow!"
- There are divisions for 4-H Members, 4-H Volunteers, and 4-H Alumni.
- Send the video file to us at <u>illinois4H@illinois.edu</u> or post it to YouTube and share the link in an email to us. Be sure to save the original file in case we need it later.
- Include your first name, your county, and your 4-H club name.
- A parent or friend can record you—you're not being evaluated on the video but on your 4-H story. Of course, the more creative the video content, the better your chance of winning.
- It's okay to tell your story over time. For example, you may want to be show a lamb when it's born, as you work on it, then in the show ring and put all those clips together into your entry.
- Videos will be accepted from May 1 to August 1. Winners will be announced and shown at the Illinois State Fair.
- Finalists may be asked to improve or edit their video to comply with Extension 4-H guidelines before their prize is awarded.

- Apply online: go.illinois.edu/4HYLT. Look for the application at the bottom of the page under "Resources."
- Deadline: June 7 (for interviews during Illini Summer Academies); July 19 (for interviews during State Fair).

The State Youth Leadership Team plans the state Jr. Leadership Conference, plans and teaches the Speaking for Illinois 4-H program, and assists for many other statewide events. Team members may serve on statewide planning committees and advisory groups, including the Illinois 4-H Foundation Board of Directors, Illinois Farm Bureau Youth Education Committee, Illini Summer Academies planning committee, and Teen Leadership Conference planning committee. Members also have the first opportunity to attend National 4-H Conference in Washington, D.C. each spring.

# Check out the masters at this year's state fair

Each county may send one entry into the Illinois State Fair Master Showmanship Contest. The contest begins at 7:30 PM Friday, Aug. 9. Exhibitors must be at least 14 and no older than 18 (as of 9/1/18). You need to supply your own animals for the contest, but may make arrangements to borrow animals from exhibitors at the fair. Top prize is \$500. The contest is sponsored by Illinois Farm Bureau and RFD Radio.

# Win \$1,000!

The Superior Young Producer Scholarship Program is offered by the Illinois State Fair to 4-H members in beef, sheep, swine, dairy, and horses as an educational activity at the Illinois State Fair to promote youth development and personal growth. Three \$1,000 scholarships will be provided in horses, and three \$1,000 scholarships will be provided in dairy. A total of nine \$1,000 scholarships will be provided in a combined contest for beef, sheep, and swine contestants. The SYPA contest is open to 4-H members who are 14 years of age or older doing project work in the species area for which they are entering. 4-H age is determined as of January 1, 2019. Participants do not have to be exhibiting animals at the Illinois State Fair to participate in the SYPA contest. Check out the dates of each contest: Horse: July 24, Beef/Sheep/Swine: August 7, Dairy: August 17. The contest is supported by the Illinois 4-H Foundation and its sponsors.
