Time for you to face your fear and give that talk! The Public Speaking Contest will be held on Saturday, April 6 at 10 AM at the Toledo Village Hall. This can be one you have given at school, something you have written, an interpretation of one of your favorite works, or just something you are passionate about. ### **Project Selection Deadline**

Be sure to pick your projects in 4Honline by May 1. The last day to order publications will be May 15. Remember Visual Arts are 13 separate projects, so you need to choose which ones you wish to exhibit in. This deadline aligns with the opening of FairEntry to start enrolling in classes for the shows in July. If you need assistance, contact Jaylynn at the Extension Office.



To better accommodate our members, their families, and the public, we have decided to move the General Projects & Foods show to begin at 3 PM on Thursday, July 11. Registration will begin at 3 PM with judging to begin at 3:30 PM. Following the completion of judging, we will have the food and games for Family Fun Night like we did last year. If you have any suggestions for games, contact the office. It will be potluck style again with Federation providing the main course.



Lambs for the 2019 Illinois State Fair Junior and Open Premiere (carcass) Shows must be, nominated, weighed, and tattooed, between (including) March 15 and May 15, 2019 at the local county level. The animals will be weighed and tattooed with the box "A" tattoo, and fill out the nomination form. The form must be signed by a local Extension employee. For the Illinois State Fair Junior and Open Premiere classes, an exhibitor may nominate a total of ten (10) wethers. Lambs must have been castrated prior to tattooing for the wether classes at the Illinois State Fair.

Non-Premiere lambs and goats for state fair (those showing in the live show only) <u>NO MORE REGIONAL CHECK-IN SITES</u> – New nomination format

All non-premiere lambs and goats for state fair junior show will be Self-Nominated in 2019 as follows:

Exhibitors fill out and send in nomination form with photo of lamb's ear with scrapie tag installed in ear (close up photo of ear so scrapie tag can be read). Nominations must be signed by local Extension Office. This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2019.

### Fair Entry & Handbooks

Fair Entry will be open from May 1 to June 1. There will be more details to come in following newsletter. Leaders—if you want to set up an evening for me to come assist you with sign-ups of your members please contact me to arrange that.

Handbooks will be distributed to new families to 4-H for the 2018-19 year. These have all the rules and guidelines for exhibition in them. These will be distributed in March/April. For those who received handbooks last year, you will get a list of updated material instead of a whole book re-printed.



It is that time of year again! Time to begin the Pantry Scavenger Hunt! It will run from November 1 through March 9. This will be the last day of Cumberland County 4-H Week. Each club is encouraged to begin their donations for this year's scavenger hunt. This is a great opportunity for the club to get involved and help out the community. 4-H'ers need to bring items to their club meeting or to any 4-H sponsored event from now until March 9, 2019.

Great news! 4-H Memorial Camp near Monticello will be offering five summer camp sessions in 2019. Choose from one of these summer sessions:

Cost will be \$230 for enrolled 4-H members. This new cost includes a \$15 credit at the Trading Post and a camper t-shirt, so you shouldn't bring cash to camp! Cost to youth not enrolled in 4-H is \$270.

#### Online ethics certification required for everyone taking 4-H animal projects

All 4-H members enrolled in an animal project area are required to complete the online **Quality As**surance and Ethics course one time in order to stay enrolled in an animal project area.

The certification must be done if you are enrolled in one of the following projects: beef, dairy, cats, dogs, goats, horses, poultry, rabbits, sheep, and swine. Members who don't complete the certification before the show will be removed from the project and not be allowed to show. Anyone who has already taken the certification does not need to retake the test. The local office has a list of those already certified. Go to go.illinois.edu/4Hqaec. This rule applies to 4-H members who exhibit live animals AND poster exhibits.

**NOTE:** The state 4-H program is reviewing a new program which may replace our current quality assurance and ethics program, but no changes will take effect prior to Sept. 1, 2019.

#### WHAT'S NEW IN 2019



We've updated the Public Presentation category. Be sure to read the new rules below! Each county can send three entries to the State 4-H Public Speaking Contest which will be held June 8 in Decatur. Go to the Illinois 4-H Website @ go.illinois.edu/IL4H. Click on EVENTS, then State 4-H Public Speaking Contest. Here are the new guidelines for your moment in the spotlight:

Formal Speech |Self-written | Notes Allowed | No props | Individual | 4-8 minutes Formal Speeches share the presenter's own unique view and are intended to motivate, persuade, or inform an audience and may include a call to action. Youth deliver a speech on any topic they wish (Original Oratory), or choose one of these four topics on which to speak (Topical Response): Welcome to the Digital Age What is My Connection to the Global Community? Power: Who Has It, Who Doesn't, and Does It Matter? If I Could See tomorrow...

**Illustrated Speech** | Self-written | Notes allowed | Illustrations Required | Individual | 4-8 minutes Illustrated Speeches may be used to inform, persuade, or motivate the audience while using a visual aid. Visual aids may be two dimensional, three-dimensional, or digital. Youth may include audience participation. Digital visual aids must be stored on a USB flash drive. Illustrated speeches may be: How-to demonstrations which show the audience how to do something, Object lessons which use objects as metaphors to share a message, Educational models where drawings or diagrams help explain a topic.

**Original Works** | Self-written | Notecards allowed | Props and Costumes Allowed | Individual or 2-Person Team | Manuscripts sent in Advance | 4-8 minutes

Original works must be written entirely by the presenter. It may be presented as an individual or a two-person team entry. Manuscripts must be sent in advance to the contest. Presentations may be designed for TV, radio, or online media and must be presented live. The types of entries could include: Prose and Short Stories, Poetry, Broadcast Media Program,

Theatrical Combined Program: Combine any number of the above elements along with other creative presentation forms

**Oral Interpretation** | Published work | Props and Costumes Allowed | Individual or 2-Person Team | Manuscripts sent in Advance | 4-8 minutes

Presentations in Oral Interpretation must be published works, and manuscripts or transcripts must be submitted prior to the event. They may be presented as an individual or a two-person team entry. The types of entries could include: Prose and Short Stories, Poetry, Theatrical Interpretation,

Published Speech Recitation: Excerpt from a spoken presentation delivered by a public figure, such as Winston Churchill, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., or Maya Angelou

Combined Program: Combine any number of the above elements along with other creative presentation forms
