- ◇ Attend one county wide Ambassador opportunity
- ◇ Highly encouraged to attend Speaking for Illinois 4-H (SFI4-H)

Opportunities:

- ◇ To network with local businesses, donors and elected officials
- ◇ To connect to the University of Illinois Extension, 4-H and the College of Agriculture, Consumer and Environmental Sciences
- ◇ To gain skills in brainstorming, creativity and evaluation
- ◇ Day trip to University of Illinois and possibly other 2 yr/4yr Illinois colleges
