# Enroll in 4-H today Online!!



It's time to enroll in 4-H, and it's a gazillion time easier than ever before! All enrollment is done ONLINE! Go to **IL.4Honline.com** and set up your family profile. Register every 4-H member in your family all at once. Choose your club. Choose your projects. BOOM! You're done. You can now view your official 4-H information and edit that information all year long from your computer or mobile device. Every change is tracked by who made the

change and the time/date changes were made to your profile.

Illinois 4-H is always looking for ways to make things easier for families and clubs. We think this is a homerun!

### Join the Speaking for Illinois 4-H Team

We're looking for 4-H members interested in spreading the great news about 4-H. 4-H members 14 years of age or older can join the **Speaking for Illinois 4-H** team. The training is **Saturday, November 9** at the Adams County Extension Office in Quincy.

The day-long training, provided by the Illinois State 4-H Youth Leadership Team, gives you the chance to explore your own 4-H history and why you are involved, put that story into words, and learn the best ways to approach donors, civic groups, elected officials, and others to talk about 4-H. Learn why 4-H believes in Positive Youth Development and how we emphasize the essential elements of Belonging, Independence, Generosity and Mastery. All of this – and more – is a part of *Speaking for Illinois 4-H*! Once you're trained, you'll receive an invitation to be a part of our Legislative Connection events at the State Capitol. There is a \$12 fee to attend the training which helps cover the cost of lunch and supplies. Use the following link to register and get additional details: go.illinois.edu/sfi4H.

#### New certification required for youth exhibiting livestock

4-H members exhibiting animals entering the food production system will be required to complete the **Youth for the Quality Care of Animal** certification (YQCA). It will replace former trainings: PQA and QAEC. This program is the industry-standard certification. Check with local offices about completing the training. The training must be completed each year. All 4-H youth ages 8-18 with the following species must complete training: swine, sheep, goats, beef cattle and dairy cattle.

#### YQCA Exempt

Horses, dogs/cats, rabbit and poultry will still be required to take the **Quality Assurance and Ethics** (QAEC) training. This training is only required once in the member's career.



# Who will win \$5,000?

The Youth in Action Award honors four 4-H members who have gained critical life skills through their 4-H experience and have used those skills to overcome a challenge or challenges they have faced. Each of the honorees epitomize 4-H youth empowerment and leadership. In addition, the winners have demonstrated the positive impact they've made with their family, peers, and community through their 4-H experiences.

Nominate outstanding 4-H members in four different categories: Agriculture, Civic Engagement, Healthy Living, and STEM. Each winner will receive a \$5,000 scholarship for higher education, be featured as the 4-H youth spokesperson for their pillar area, receive an all-expenses paid trip to Washington, D.C. to be recognized at National 4-H Council's Legacy Awards, and network with celebrities and prominent 4-H alumni. #### 2019-2020 Re-Enrollment/New Member Process for 4-H Online

JOIN TODAY

New Year Enrollment Starts Today

We Get To Do It All Aggin!

On Sept. 7th 4-H Online will be available to enroll for the new 4-H year!

4-H Members (and leaders) who were enrolled in 4-H during the past 4-H year will not need to create a new profile for the new 2019-2020 4-H Year. They just need to re-enroll for the new year. **You must do this online!** 

#### (IF YOU ARE A TAG-A-LONG CLOVERBUD YOU NEED TO FOLLOW THIS SAME PROCESS!)

(If you are a NEW 4-H member and no one in your family is in 4-H you will need to setup a profile to begin).

Go to: 4honline.com, pick Illinois, then I have a profile, put in your email and password. (If you have forgot your password pick forgot my password. (Then the system will send you an email)

Login to your 4-H Online Family Account and choose the option to continue to Family.

You will see a list of all Family members that have been enrolled in the past. All members and volunteers will show Inactive. (If you have multiple people you will need to repeat for each member.) If you have a new member in your family you can add a new member here.

Choose Edit for the person you wish to Re-enroll.

You will see a summary screen of the information for the individual. At the very bottom you will see an option to Enroll for the new 4-H year. Click on that button.

After choosing to Enroll, the screen will come up with the information for that individual. Make any necessary changes. (phone # chgs, address, etc.)

The Authorizations will be cleared from the previous year, so it will be necessary to sign the Photo Release, Liability Waiver and Code of Conduct again for the new year. (a paper copy of the liability waiver will be given to you to sign by your leader so no need to print).

When you get to the Participation tab, the member will still be in the same clubs as the previous year. If he/she will not be in the club again for the new year, Delete that club and select a new club or clubs.

Under the Projects portion of the Participation tab, the member will still be enrolled in the same projects from the previous year. Select any new projects, and remove any that he/she will not continue in. Removing a project will not remove it from historical information. Select projects manuals ONLY if you need them!!

Choose Continue to advance to the Invoice screen. This screen will show the Program Fee for the new year. It will show you owe \$20. Just click to continue.

Make sure the County/Club 4-H check is marked for your payment option and then click Select Payment Method. **Do not send a check, the Edwards Co. Federation is paying your fee this year!** 

#### Submit the Enrollment!

You will receive an email and so will the county office. If we find errors in the enrollment, we will send you an email asking for correction; otherwise you will get a confirmation email stating your member has been accepted. Continue the process for the next member or simply log out.
