General Award Information

- Individual Excellence Awards nominations must be made by someone other than the nominee.
 - Winners are not eligible for nomination again until two years after their previous win.
- 2. Team awards may include staff from all job roles regardless of their "home base" location. Field staff team awards may include any field-based staff (AP and/or Civil Service) and campus-based staff involved in the project. The application must be submitted by a field-based AP or Civil Service staff member.

3. General Eligibility

- Individuals and teams may submit more than one award application; however, the same application can only be submitted in one award category.
- The effort was completed within the last three years.
- Must be a current permanent employee of Illinois Extension during the application period and the award presentation at Annual Conference. If an individual discontinues their employment with Illinois Extension before the award presentation, they will forfeit the award. If a team member discontinues their employment with Illinois Extension before the award presentation, they will be removed from the team application and forfeit their portion of the award.
- Teams will involve at least two members and no more than 10.
- Team awards <u>may</u> include a mix of program staff, campus-based, field-based, and office support/admin.

4. Categories and what they mean:

- Campus staff any staff member who is based out of a campus office.
- Program staff EPC, Educator, or Community worker who serves a program area.
- Field staff any staff member based out of a Unit field office.
- AP Academic professional, i.e., educator, director, specialist, etc.
- CS Civil service staff, i.e., community worker, coordinator, office support, etc.

5. Application Process

- All nominations and applications must be via Canvas go.illinois.edu/ExtensionExcellenceAwards.
- Application deadline September 1, 2024.

6. Judging Process

- Previous year's winners are expected to participate as judges for the current award year.
- If there are not enough judges, the Professional Training and Development Associate may ask other staff members to serve on the selection committee.
- More than one judge will review each award category, and the winners will be determined based on the highest scores. If there is a tie, another member of the committee will be asked to break the tie.
- The awards selection committee may move an application to another award category if they believe it is a better fit for the criteria.
