

4-H ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

Reminder for ALL 4-H families, superintendents, and volunteers, you need to go register at the 4-H Online website for the current 4-H year. If you were enrolled last year go to the link below and select "I Forgot My Password", use the email address that you gave last year and it will prompt you to create a new password. Follow the step- by- step enrollment process and submit enrollment at the end. If you have more than one child, you will have to do one for each of them. Effingham County 4-H

4-H Shared Agreement

Illinois 4-H members may participate in 4-H under a shared membership arrangement with another county; however, approval must be granted by both counties prior to enrollment by completing the 4-H Shared Membership Agreement form. Members may not benefit economically from exhibiting the same project at multiple local or county 4-H exhibitions, fairs or shows, including premiums, auctions, trophies, ribbons and other awards. Members may apply for 4-H awards or recognition in only one county. 4-H program fee should be paid in the county of residence.

Fiscal Resources

4-H belongs to the United States.

It's the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture who oversees 4-H and makes sure that anyone who uses the 4-H name is using it for the good of its members. 4-H clubs have permission to use the 4-H name and the Clover emblem, but we must follow all federal, state and local laws. Here are the most important rules for 4-H clubs. Most of the money which funds 4-H comes from local, state and federal tax revenue. Therefore, 4-H clubs are held to a high degree of accountability. Each year, clubs must indicate whether they will have financial activity in their club by completing an Indication of Financial Activity form and turning it in to the County Extension Office.

4-H Club Guidelines for Meetings

4-H Clubs may begin holding their meetings while abiding by the following guidelines:

- 1. Social distancing required; gathering size limited to the lesser of 10 people indoors/25 people outdoors or 50% of space capacity (warning level); 25 people indoors/ 25 people outdoors or 50% of space capacity (non-warning level)
- 2. Masks must be worn
- 3. A virtual meeting option is strongly recommended even if clubs decide to have a face to face meeting
- 4. 4-H Clubs will need to identify a safety monitor to oversee the compliance of best practice guidelines.
- 5. Clubs will need to complete a 4-H Club Safety Management Plan, which will be further discussed with club leaders.

General COVID-19 Guidelines for Extension Volunteers

Best Practice Guidelines

Practice best practices for personal protection and hygiene in order to protect you and those around you. https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html

- ★ Clean and wash your hands for a minimum of 20 seconds before and after volunteering. Follow the same practice if you take breaks during your volunteer time.
- ★ Avoid physical contact with others and maintain a distance of at least six feet.
- ★ Cover your cough and sneezes with your elbow or a tissue.
- ★ If soap and water are not available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.
- ★ Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- ★ Wear a cloth face covering when you cannot maintain at least six feet distance form others.

If you become ill with COVID-19 like symptoms AFTER volunteering, notify your local public health department so the proper procedures can be followed. The public health department will coordinate any contact tracing efforts and will notify Illinois Extension of any possible exposure.

DO DO NOT

DO consider any risk that may be associated with the task and DO NOT take part if you feel uncomfortable with the risk level.

DO coordinate with the Extension 4-H staff before volunteering and follow all additional guidelines set forth in your 4-H Club Safety Management Plan. DO NOT volunteer if you have experienced any of the following over the past 14 days:

- Have any of the symptoms related to COVID-19 as identified by the Centers for Disease Control and the Department of Health https://www.dph.illinois.gov/topics-services/diseases-and-conditions/diseases-a-z-list/coronavirus/symptoms-treatment.
- Have been around anyone who has COVID-19
- Have been contacted by a contact tracer informing you that you have been exposed to someone who has tested COVID-19 positive
- Traveled to any foreign country
- Been on a cruise or been in an airport
- Been to an event with more than 50 people

DO NOT volunteer if you are in a high-risk category as outlined by the CDC. https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/need-extra-precautions/people-at-higher-risk.html

DO NOT volunteer if you live with or are in frequent contact with people in higher-risk categories.

This is an evolving situation, so these guidelines are subject to change, based on guidance from the University of Illinois and guidelines provided by the Centers for Disease Control. We appreciate the commitment of our volunteers to these volunteer programs, as well as your patience and commitment to safety as we navigate the times.
