

IF YOU ARE ENROLLED IN DAIRY CATTLE, BEEF CATTLE, SWINE, SHEEP, AND/OR GOATS:

All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the

# Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) program,

by attending class taught by a local veterinarian.

#### There will be three local options for a face-to-face training:

- March 19, 7pm, Madison County Fairgrounds Expo Building, 2025 Parkhill Dr., Highland
- March 31, 7pm, Monroe County Annex, 901 Illinois Ave., Waterloo
- April 25, 1pm, Scheve Park Ag Building, 905 Park Dr., Mascoutah

There is a \$3 fee to YQCA to certify each year if you exhibit one of the above livestock species.

Choose "Sign in with 4-H Online" and Illinois 4-H Youth Development. Sign into your 4-H Online account.

Select member that is enrolled in one of the above listed livestock projects.

Choose the appropriate age and choose "Instructor-Led Training." \$3.00.

Choose Illinois and then the training you wish to attend, then click on the red "Purchase Course" button. Training must be paid for via credit card. If this option is not available for your family, please contact the Extension office as soon as possible.

Repeat registration process with each family member required to take the training.

If you are unable to attend one of the face-to-face meetings, you may take the YQCA training online following the same directions as above, but selecting the online training for \$12. Please contact the Extension office if this is the option you are using. Please complete by May 1.

## IF YOU ARE ENROLLED HORSES, RABBITS, POULTRY, DOGS, AND/OR CATS:

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for youth in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs and cats. You only need to take it once in your lifetime. Those who don't complete the training will be removed from the animal science project and will not be eligible to exhibit at county fairs.

# **College Scholarship Opportunities**



#### MONROE COUNTY EXTENSION & 4-H EDUCATION FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Applicants must be seniors in high school and/or have not reached their nineteenth birthday on or before September 1, 2019 and must have been enrolled and active in a 4-H club program for at least <u>four</u> consecutive years. The applicant must be a resident of Monroe County and/or attend the Waterloo, Columbia, Valmeyer or Red Bud School districts. 4-H members can only receive the Scholarship once. #### MONROE COUNTY FARM BUREAU FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

High school seniors may contact the Monroe County Farm Bureau office via phone at 939-6197 or email, <a href="mcfarm@htc.net">mcfarm@htc.net</a> to request that an application be emailed to the interested individual. All applications must be typed. Applications and all supporting documents must be received by **February 15** to be considered.

To be eligible for consideration, an applicant must be a high school senior graduating in May of 2020, be a member or child of a member of the Monroe County Farm Bureau since at least January 1, 2019, be accepted or plan to enroll in a post-secondary school in an agriculture curriculum, exhibit potential for successful completion of course of study, 2.0 minimum GPA and be a resident of Monroe County.

#### FARM CREDIT ILLINOIS SCHOLARSHIPS

High school seniors planning careers in agriculture may apply for a \$2,000 scholarship. Farm Credit Illinois will provide 30 scholarships to youth who live or farm in one of the 60 counties in their service area. The first \$1,000 will be distributed for the Fall 2019 semester, and the second \$1,000 will be applied during the Fall 2021 semester. ## 2020 Steers, Market Heifers, Barrows, Wethers, & Meat Goats Birth, Ownership and Tattoo Dates for Illinois State Fair Junior Show

#### STEERS:

Calved on or after January 1, 2019. Owned & personally cared for by exhibitor since – February 1, 2020•Weighed, Tattooed & Tagged –On or between the last Saturday in January (January 25, 2020) and February 29,2020.

#### **BARROWS: Regular Barrows**

• Farrowed on or after January 1, 2020 and must be the property of the exhibitor by June 1,2020. No weighing and tattooing required but must submit ear notches when making entry for ISF

#### **BARROWS: Premiere Barrows**

Farrowed on or after February 10, 2020 and must have been the property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2020. Weighed and Tattooed with Box A tattoo from February 10 to April 15, 2020. Tattooed within 35 days of birth and not weigh more than 1.0 lbs/day of age. Junior exhibitors can purchase pre-nominated barrows.

#### **SHEEP Market Wethers & Market Ewe Lambs:**

Lambed on or after January 1, 2020. Ownership Date – May 15, 2020

Self-nomination as follows: Nominations must be signed by local Extension Office.

Exhibitors fill out and send in nomination form with photo of lamb's ear with scrapie tag installed in ear (close up photo of ear so scrapie tag can be read). This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2020.

#### Jr. and Open Premiere Wether & Ewe lambs: - Weigh-in, tattoo, and nomination procedures:

Junior and open premiere lambs will be nominated, tattooed, and weighed at the county level.

Premiere lambs must be weighed and tattooed with the Box A tattoo followed by a number starting with 1 - This must be witnessed by a local Extension employee or a person they designate, such as a volunteer or local sheep superintendent.

Completed nomination forms must be signed by the local Extension Office. Send nomination forms to Dan Jennings. Ownership and nomination deadline is March 15 to May 15, 2019. Lambed on or after January 1, 2020

#### **Meat Goat Wethers:**

Born on or after October 1, 2019

Ownership dates for Kids & Yearlings not in milk – May 15, 2020

Self-nomination as follows: Nominations must be signed by local Extension office. Exhibitors fill out and send in nomination form with photo of goat's ear with scrapie tag installed in ear (close up photo of ear so scrapie tag can be read). This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2020.
