For the 2019 fairs, Quality Assurance & Ethics testing will still be required for any 4-H youth enrolled in <u>any</u> animal project who haven't already completed the course. The training can be found here:

YQCA will not be required this year, but will most likely be a requirement for the 2019-2020 4-H year.



## New Process

There will be no regional sheep and goat tattooing this year.

Instead, exhibitors planning to show at the State Fair should follow this process for nomination.

#### For exhibitors not showing premiere:

- 1. Get a nomination form from Jennifer/Extension Office.
- 2. Take close-up photos of Scrapie tag in the ear of each of your nominated animals. Pictures must be clear and tags logible. Tag must be

and tags legible. Tag must be permanently affixed in ear.

3. Return completed nomination form and pictures to the Extension office for signature and submission to the State.



4. Nominations must be done between March 15 and May 15. They must be returned to Extension office prior to May 15!

#### For exhibitors showing Premiere:

1. Contact the Extension office to set-up a time to weigh and tattoo lambs between March 15 and May 15.

### Premiere Swine

- Farrowed on or after
   February 10, 2019
- Barrows must be nominated, ear-notched & tattooed by April 15.
- Must be tattooed before they are 35 days old and must not weigh more than 1lb per day of age.
- Contact Jennifer to set-up a time to tattoo before **April 15.**





You must have been a member for at least 5 years and attending either a 4-year university, community college, or trade school. The scholarship is open to high school seniors and college freshmen. Market Wethers & Ewes - Lambed on or after January 1. Ownership date: May 15, 2019

Meat Goat Wethers - Born on or after October 1, 2018. Ownership date: May 15, 2019

Heifers - September 1 to March 31, 2019. Owned by June 1.

Dairy - Cows owned by January 1, 2019. Calves and heifers owned by June 1, 2019.

Gilts - Farrowed on or after January 1. Owned by June 1.

Ewes & Rams - Owned by June 25, 2019

Meat Goats - Owned by May 15, 2019

\*\*Note: These ownership dates are for State Fair, they do not necessarily reflect your county's dates.\*\*

# What's New in 2019

### **Public Presentations**

We've updated the Public Presentation category. Be sure to read the new rules below! Each county can send three entries to the State 4-H Public Speaking Contest which will be held June 8 in Decatur. Go to <u>go.illinois.edu/IL4H</u>. Click on EVENTS, then State 4-H Public Speaking Contest. Here are the new guidelines for your moment in the spotlight:

#### Formal Speech |Self-written | Notes Allowed | No props | Individual | 4-8 minutes

Formal Speeches share the presenter's own unique view and are intended to motivate, persuade, or inform an audience and may include a call to action. Youth deliver a speech on any topic they wish **(Original Oratory)**, or choose one of these four topics: Welcome to the Digital Age, What is My Connection to the Global Community?, Power: Who Has It, Who Doesn't, and Does It Matter? If I Could See tomorrow...

#### Illustrated Speech | Self-written | Notes allowed | Illustrations Required | Individual | 4-8 minutes

Illustrated Speeches may be used to inform, persuade, or motivate the audience while using a visual aid. Visual aids may be two dimensional, three-dimensional, or digital. Youth may include audience participation. Digital visual aids must be stored on a USB flash drive. Illustrated speeches may be: How-to demonstrations which show the audience how to do something. Object lessons which use objects as metaphors to share a message. Educational models where drawings or diagrams help explain a topic.

#### Original Works | Self-written | Notecards allowed | Props and Costumes Allowed | Individual or 2-Person Team | Manuscripts sent in Advance | 4-8 minutes

Original works must be written entirely by the presenter. Manuscripts must be sent in advance. Presentations may be designed for TV, radio, or online media and must be presented live.

#### Oral Interpretation | Published work | Props and Costumes Allowed | Individual or 2-Person Team | Manuscripts sent in Advance | 4-8 minutes

Presentations in Oral Interpretation must be published works, and manuscripts or transcripts must be submitted prior to the event.



Spend 6 nights and 7 days on the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign campus for Illini Summer Academies. Registration opens March 1 at go.illinois.edu/illini4H. Check in at 3 PM Sunday, June 23. The conference ends the morning of Saturday, June 29.

The conference is open to youth who will have completed 8<sup>th</sup> thru 12<sup>th</sup> grade by the time of the conference and will be at least 14 by Sept. 1, 2019. Cost varies based on the Academy track you choose! Limited scholarships are available.
