Owned by February 1, 2022 Barrows: Farrowed on or after January 1, 2022 Owned by June 1, 2022 Premiere Barrows: Farrowed on or after February 10, 2022 Owned by June 1, 2022 Sheep: Lambed on or after January 1, 2022 Owned by May 15, 2022 Meat Goat Wethers: Born on or after October 1, 2021 Owned by May 15, 2022

Breeding Animals

Heifers: Owned by June 1, 2022 Cows: Owned by January 2, 2022 Gilts: Owned by June 1, 2022 Sheep: Owned by June 25, 2022 Dairy Goat Kids: Owned by June 1, 2022 Milking Does: Owned by January 1, 2022 Meat Goats: Owned by May 15, 2022 Rabbits & Poultry: Owned by June 1, 2022
