Deadline: April 15, 2023

Applicants must be seniors in high school who have not reached their nineteenth birthday on or before September 1, 2022, and must have been enrolled and active in a 4-H club program for at least four consecutive years. The applicant must be a resident of Monroe County and or reside in the Waterloo, Columbia, Valmeyer, or Red Bud School districts.

4-H members can only receive the Scholarship once. Applicants must be accepted into or be attending a post-high school education program.

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2023 BREEDING ANIMALS BIRTH & OWNERSHIP DATES FOR ILLINOIS STATE FAIR JUNIOR SHOW

STEERS:

- Calved on or after January 1, 2022
- Owned & personally cared for by exhibitor since February 1, 2023
- Weighed, Tattooed, and EID tagged: February 18, 2023 (Monroe County)

BARROWS: Regular Barrows

 Farrowed on or after January 1, 2023, and must be the property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2023. No weighing and tattooing required but must submit ear notches when making an entry for ISF

BARROWS: Premiere Barrows (carcass class)

- Farrowed on or after February 10, 2023, and must have been the property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2023
- Weighed and Tattooed with Box A tattoo from February 10 to April 15, 2023
- Tattooed within 35 days of birth and not weigh more than 1.0 lbs/day of age
- Junior exhibitors can purchase pre-nominated barrows

SHEEP Market Wethers & Market Ewe Lambs: Live Show Wethers

No more Regional check-in sites - New nomination format

- Lambed on or after January 1, 2023
- Ownership Date May 15, 2023
- Self-nomination as follows: Nominations must be signed by the local Extension Office.
- Exhibitors fill out and send in a nomination form with a photo of a lamb's ear with a scrapie tag installed in the ear (close-up photo of the ear so scrapie tag can be read). This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2022. Send to Dan Jennings, Region 1 Office, 1100 E., Warrenville Rd., Suite 170, Naperville, IL 60563.

Jr. and Open Premiere Wether & Ewe Lambs

- Weigh-in, tattoo, and nomination procedures:
- Junior and open premiere lambs will be nominated, tattooed, and weighed at the county level.
- Premiere lambs must be weighed and tattooed with the Box A tattoo followed by a number starting with 1 This must be witnessed by a local Extension employee or a person they designate, such as a volunteer or local sheep superintendent.
- The local Extension Office must sign completed nomination forms.
- Send nomination forms to Dan Jennings (address above).
- Ownership and nomination deadline is March 15 to May 15, 2023.
- Lambed on or after January 1, 2023.

Meat Goat Wethers: Live Show Wethers

No more Regional check-in sites - New nomination format

- Wethers Born on or after October 1, 2022
- Ownership dates for Kids & Yearlings not in milk May 15, 2023
- Self-nomination as follows: Nominations must be signed by the local Extension office.
- Exhibitors fill out and send in a nomination form with a photo of goat's ear with a scrapie tag installed in the ear (close-up photo of the ear so scrapie tag can be read). 2023 BREEDING ANIMALS BIRTH & OWNERSHIP DATES FOR ILLINOIS STATE FAIR JUNIOR SHOW

BEEF - HEIFERS AND COWS

Heifers

- Age requirement is from September 1, 2021, to March 31, 2023 (w/ addition of Senior Yearling class)
- Owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor since June 1, 2023
- Performance Cows
- Cows must be born before September 1, 2021 (Cow-Calf Class only)
- Owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor since January 1, 2023

SWINE - GILTS

- Age requirement is farrowed on or after January 1, 2023
- Owned by exhibitor since June 1, 2023

SHEEP - EWES & RAMS

- Age requirement for yearling ewes is from January 1, 2022, to August 31, 2022
- Age requirement for ewe lambs is after September 1, 2022
- Age requirement for ram lambs is after January 1, 2023
- Owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor since June 25, 2023

DAIRY - COWS AND HEIFERS

- No age requirements
- Calves and Heifers Owned since June 1, 2023
- Cows Owned since January 1, 2023

HORSE & PONY

• On or before June 1 – Copies of the ownership and/or lease papers, State Fair Entries, and one set of photos sent to Stephanie Hardy at Illinois State Fair Entry Department, P.O. Box 19427, Springfield IL, 62794-9427. PH: 217-782-0786

DOGS:

- Dogs must be owned or leased by June 1, 2023
- At this time, no paperwork is required to be on file. Make entries via 4-H Fair Entry Program.

DAIRY GOATS

- Kids and Yearlings not in milk must be owned by the exhibitor only by June 1, 2023
- Milking Does must be owned by the exhibitor only by January 1, 2023.

MEAT GOATS

• All meat goats (wethers and all breeding animals) will be owned by the exhibitor by May 15, 2023.

RABBITS. PYGMY GOATS & POULTRY

 Animals in these species that are to be exhibited at the ISF Jr. Show must be owned by the exhibitor as indicated: Does -- By June 1 of the year exhibiting; All others -- Out of stock owned by the exhibitor before June 1.



COUNTY/STATE LIVESTOCK SHOW REQUIREMENTS

Quality Assurance & Ethics Certification (QAEC)

Taking QAEC training is mandatory for all **horse, rabbit, poultry, and companion animal** projects. Please visit:

https://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/

All county and state horse and dog exhibitors must complete QAEC via this site **once** during their showing career. Those that have completed it in the past do not have to complete it again.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

The YQCA training is mandatory yearly for all 4-H **beef**, **dairy**, **goat**, **sheep**, **and swine** exhibitors.

Please watch your email and upcoming newsletters for upcoming YQCA training date options.

Training must be completed by June 1.



4-H SHOW REQUIREMENTS

As we begin the new 4-H year, please remember that to show projects at the County and State levels at the end of the year; you must meet the following requirements:

- Attend at least <u>four meetings</u> during the 4-H year.
- Give a talk or demonstration.
- Enroll in 4-H by January 1, 2023.
- All livestock project members must show their leader an in-progress
 Livestock Record Book at their May, June, or July Club meeting before the county fair.

LIVESTOCK AUCTION

To participate in the youth livestock auction, sponsored by the Monroe Co. Extension & 4-H Education Foundation, youth must meet the following requirements:

- Be a 4-H or FFA member age 8-19 on or before Sept. 1 of the previous year.
- Be a Monroe County resident and/or reside within the Waterloo, Columbia, Valmeyer or Red Bud school districts.
- Be a member of the Monroe County 4-H club and/or FFA Chapter in the Waterloo, Columbia, Valmeyer or Red Bud school districts.
- Attend at least 4 meetings during the 4-H year
- Give a talk or demonstration.
- Enroll in 4-H by January 1, 2023.
- All livestock project members must show an in-progress Livestock Record Book to their Leader at their May, June or July Club meeting prior to the county fair.
- *NEW: Members must complete a livestock record book in 2023 in order to be eligible to sell in 2024, with the exception of new members.
- *NEW: Exhibitors may sell TWO of any species, beef, sheep, swine, goat, rabbit, poultry or dairy basket.
- *NEW: Dairy cattle and dairy goat exhibitors showing 2 or more dairy animals are eligible to auction a dairy basket of products or certificates with a minimum value of \$50.
- If a 4-H or FFA member receives Grand Champion and/or Reserve Champion in any specie area, they will have the opportunity to sell the Grand or Reserve Champion regardless of the number of other species they plan to sell, as long as all of the additional sale requirements are met.

CHAPERONE OPPORTUNITIES: Volunteer chaperones can apply using the same registration link listed above.

Chaperones must be fully screened volunteers. Those wanting to be a conference chaperone or a changemaker mentor but are not screened should contact their local Extension office to begin that process as soon as possible due to the lengthy time to get screening results returned.

1) Changemaker Mentor: Mentors will be responsible for supporting the teen Changemakers as they develop their Changemaker Action Plan during the conference; mentors will also assist teens with implementation of their plan when they return home. The role of a Changemaker Mentor is to: 1) be an active listener who is enthusiastic about helping the teens achieve their goals; 2) show the teens respect, provide honest feedback, and recognize that their role is to support, not to take over the project; and 3) serve as a cheerleader, encouraging the teens while providing guidance and advice to help the teen(s) achieve their end goal. There is a registration fee for this type of volunteer since they have no other responsibilities during the conference.

2) Conference Chaperone Responsibilities: Chaperones will be responsible for assisting conference staff monitor workshop and activities during the conference, conduct attendance checks at Saturday night curfew and Sunday breakfast, and encourage students to engage in conference activities. The ultimate goal is to have conference participants to have fun, safe, and enjoyable learning 4-H experience. With adults and participants following the rules, we can ensure a positive experience for everyone in attendance. There is no registration fee for this type of chaperone. Yes, you can be both a conference chaperone and a mentor and not have a registration fee.
