
Dear Valued Stakeholder:

Educators offer Webinar Series for Beginning Gardeners

During our time of quarantine, there is still one thing we can all do – garden! During the month of April, Horticulture Educator Austin Little and Local Foods and Small Farms Educator Katie Bell teamed up to teach a program for beginning gardeners.

The six-part webinar series offered tips and provided an opportunity for participants to ask questions on a variety of gardening topics. Little and Bell discussed site selection and preparation, soils, plant selection, plant nutrition, companion planting, succession planting, and harvesting.

Transitioning the in-person series to a webinar allowed the program to be delivered to a state-wide audience with some participants even joining in from neighboring states.
