It is my pleasure to present this brief impact report of the programs and events offered to the residents of Franklin, Jackson, Perry, Randolph and Williamson Counties during this past month.




Educator leads activity on the influential role of experiences on brain development

Family Life Educator Robin Ridgley worked with area school teachers to understand how positive and negative early childhood experiences can impact an individual's lifespan. The Brain Architecture Game is a tabletop experience that builds understanding of the influential role of experiences on early brain development — what promotes it, what derails it, and the resulting consequences for society. The goal is to build a "brain" that is as tall (functional) and sturdy (withstanding stress) as possible. Tools used during the game include pipe cleaners (basic brain structure), straws (positive experiences or support), and weights (traumatic events/stressors).



I enjoyed the brain architecture game. It was a great way to realize what kind of trauma kids can go through at a young age and how it affects them.

We need to be "straws" and a support system for them.
