New Community Map Locates Food Assistance Sites



Over two million Illinois residents rely on the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program for food assistance according to May totals from Illinois Department of Human Services. That number increased 14.4% from January as the effects of COVID-19 impacted the financial stability and food security of individuals and households across the state.

To help Illinois residents and families meet their basic food needs, University of Illinois Extension launched a new Illinois community food map that allows individuals to search by Illinois zip code for all food resources in that area. Powered by FoodFinder, Inc., the Illinois food resource map combines input from Illinois Extension, Feeding Illinois and the food

bank network, Illinois State Board of Education, Illinois Department of Human Services, Illinois Department on Aging, Illinois Office of Emergency Management, and other state and private agencies who collaborated to create this inclusive list of food resources.One can find options in their local area online at: https://eat-move-save.extension.illinois.edu/.

Franklin County 4-H receives donation to support youth initiatives

Local farmer Diann Browning recently directed a \$2,500 America's Farmers Grow Communities donation, sponsored by Bayer Fund, to Franklin County 4-H.
