Beef Weigh-In

The 2020 Beef Weigh-in will be Feb 1, 10am, at the Fairgrounds. You are required to bring your animals if you wish to enter in the Rate of Gain or Premiere classes at the fair. OR if you wish to show your animals in certain classes at the State Fair.

You are able to nominate 3 head for the county classes. Each animal must have a minimum of 450 pounds or a maximum of 900 pounds to qualify.

Please notify the office if you plan on coming and if any will be nominated for state. In case of a snow storm, those we know are coming, will be notified. Snow date is Feb 8.

New Required Livestock Training

The YQCA is a new livestock quality assurance program that is replacing PQA (which no longer exists). It also replaces the Quality Assurance & Ethics (QAEC) program for youth in the following species; dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats. All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program yearly starting for the 2020 show season. Youth must either attend a face to face class or certify on-line via the website http://yqca.org The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18, and young adults 19-21. This certification is annual with test out options of 1-3 years. Youth exhibiting swine at the Illinois State Fair and 4-H fairs are no longer required to be PQA plus certified. The estimated cost for the face to face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

Lee County will offer the live training on March 4th at 6pm. It will take place at the Amboy Community Building. Registration information will be available soon and emailed to those who are required to take it.

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats. Members must take the training whether they own a live animal or not. It is advised that they complete this one time as soon as they are enrolled in the project area. Counties will monitor completion of this. Failure to complete QA&E will

result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs. The website is open year round @ http://web.extension.illinois.edu/gaec/

NOTE: Youth must be logged on to a computer for this program, either a desktop or laptop; not an iPad or iPhone. The program cannot capture the information for county staff to see when it is completed using iPads or iPhones. Contact the office if you'd like to use one of our computers to complete this training.

The Illinois 4-H Foundation welcomes nominations for the 2020 4-H Family Spirit Award. The Illinois 4-H Family Spirit Award recognizes a family with at least three generations and at least 15 different family members (including in-laws) that have either been 4-H members, leaders, or volunteers with at least 100 cumulative years of 4-H membership or volunteerism represented within the family. Selection is based on the total number of family members with 4-H connections, the total number of years of 4-H involvement, the diversity of experiences and recognitions earned by the 4-H members, and the collective impact that family members have made as advocates of their county and state 4-H programs. 

Who Can Attend 4-H Camp?

4-H Camp is open to all youth, ages 8-14 by June 8, 2020. Campers do not have to be a 4-H member to attend 4-H Camp. Youth need to be interested in and excited about having a week of outdoor fun, away from television and technology, where they can make new friends and try new things.

Want to Know About the Location?

Thank you for your interest in 4-H Camp at Rock River Christian Camp in Polo, IL. Rock River Christian Camp has 94 acres that have been transformed over the years into a beautiful facility for youth and adults.

Life at 4-H Camp

At 4-H Camp, youth will have new experiences while in a safe environment where they can develop new skills. With the great outdoors as a background, staff, in cooperation with 4-H Camp counselors, have designed activities to teach life lessons, using creative problem solving and teamwork to achieve a common goal. The cabin atmosphere shows campers how to live cooperatively by sharing chores and respecting each other's differences.

At camp, EVERYONE belongs!

So youth can be completely engaged at camp, cell phones and electronic devices are not permitted.

Check-In/Check-Out & Leave Policy

Campers and their families will need to check-in on <u>Monday</u> between 6:00 - 6:30 p.m. - No Exceptions!

Parents should return to camp check-out on <u>Friday</u> between 6:00 - 6:30 p.m. Parents will be asked to provide a photo ID at check-out. <u>Early</u> <u>departures are not allowed</u>.

4-H Camp does not permit campers to leave during the camp week for activities such as sports, vacations, etc. Making special arrangements for individuals to leave can compromise the safety and services being provided for the group as a whole.

Speaking of Safety

Staff at RRCC are certified in First Aid, CPR and AED. There is a qualified first aid person at camp at all times. Campers select their own activities, and are supervised at all times. If there is an accident, or a problem with a camper, the parent/guardian is contacted immediately. Except in emergency situations, campers and counselors are not allowed to make or receive phone calls. 4-H Youth Development staff extensively train all camp counselors.

We strive to maintain an environment that both encourages personal growth and creates an unforgettable summer experience.

Camp Fee Schedule

Register by March 1: \$250 (4-H Members) \$270(non 4-H Members)

Must be paid in full by March 1 or price goes up.

Register <u>after March 1</u>: \$300(4-H Members)

\$320 (non 4-H Members)

Must be paid in full by May 20 or spot not held.

Contact your local Extension Office **prior to** registration to see if financial assistance opportunities are available.

Limited funds are available from the Illinois 4-H Foundation for families expressing a need for financial assistance. Also, a limited amount of funds are available for youth in DeKalb, Ogle, and Lee counties, sponsored by CHS.
